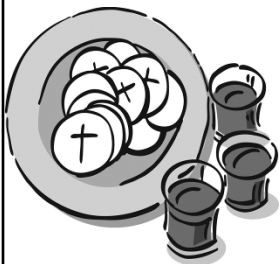

Narrative Lectionary Stories for March 2018

March 4: John 18:12-27

Peter's Denial

Peter denies Jesus and is filled with shame. We have often denied our Lord out of fear and doubt. Yet, Jesus never denies us and goes to the cross for us not because we are perfect but because we need forgiveness and salvation.

March 11: John 18:28-40

Jesus and Pilate

Pilate asks, "What is truth?" Pilate is unwilling to see the truth that Jesus is innocent. For us, truth is that Jesus loved us so much that He gives his life for ours.

March 18: John 19:1-16a

Jesus Condemned

The people shout out for Jesus to be crucified. Pilate presents Jesus as a king and the people deny it. But Jesus comes not as an earthly king but as a heavenly one and will show that true power comes not in wealth but in sacrifice and love.

March 25: John 19:16b-37

The Crucified Messiah

Jesus is crucified. His work is finished. The Son of God is dead. But the story is not over. The story is just beginning.

Narrative Lectionary Stories for April 2018

April 1: John 20:1-18

Easter / Resurrection

Jesus is Risen! What seems foolish to the world is salvation for us who believe. The Son of God has defeated sin and death and risen from the grave so that we would have eternal life. Alleluia!

April 8: John 20:19-31

Thomas

Doubt is not the enemy of faith. We all have doubt. Thomas doubted. But confronted with the resurrected Jesus, Thomas believed. We believe not because we have seen, but through the power of the Holy Spirit that this resurrected Jesus has risen for us.

April 15: Acts 9:1-19a

Called into Christ's Service

Saul condoned the killing of Christians. But after encountering Christ, Saul became Paul and became the greatest of all evangelists. The grace of God transforms us, even those we feel might be lost forever.

April 22: Acts 16:16-34

Paul and Silas

Paul and Silas, through their preaching, threatened the established order. But through their preaching, the freed people from their demons and showed them that salvation comes through faith in Jesus Christ.

April 29: Acts 17:16-31

Paul in Athens

Paul continued to travel, sharing the Good News. For some, this Good News was easy to understand and for others, it wasn't. Yet, Paul persisted and continued to share the God's love through Jesus.

THE WAITING GAME

Life involves lots of waiting. We wait in groups, in lines, in cars. We wait for packages, for the bus, for the sun to rise. We wait in doctors' offices, at the post office, at the DMV. Waiting implies we're at someone else's mercy, but it's also usually linked to HOPE. Perhaps that's why Paul Tillich called waiting a metaphor for faith. Why would one wait if there weren't the firm belief that the object of one's wait will eventually materialize?

Waiting can be enervating, which is why Isaiah 40:31 is so promising: "They who wait upon the Lord shall renew their strength." Yet waiting is tough if you have nothing to do while waiting. That's why Jesus, when talking about waiting, also talked about working — work for the night is coming. Sometimes it's less tiring to work than it is to wait.

There's a lot of waiting during Lent. You're waiting for a payoff. You're waiting for the Resurrection. You're waiting for spiritual growth. And then you realize this isn't waiting at all. It's life. It's joy. It's opportunity. It's blessing.

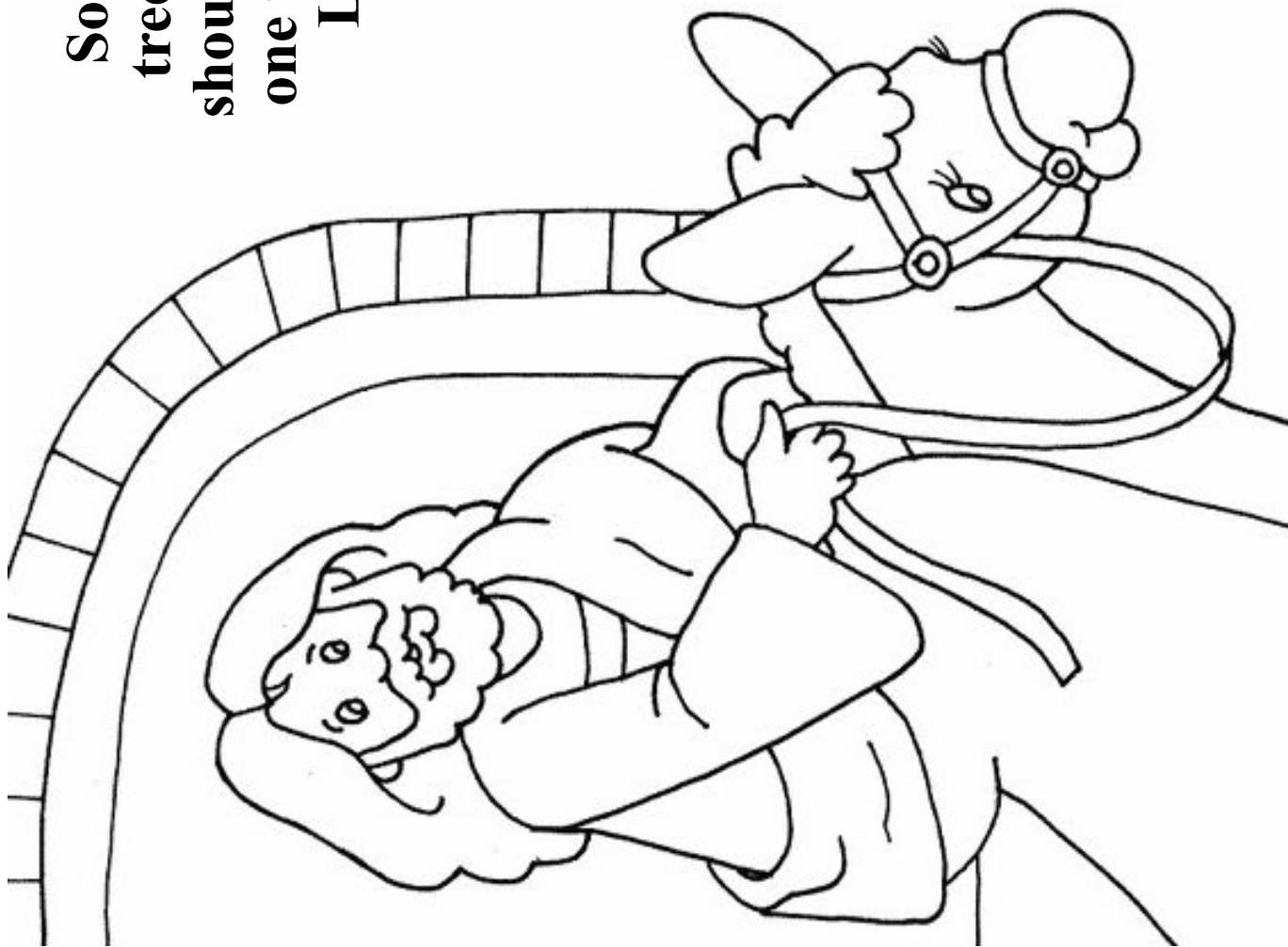

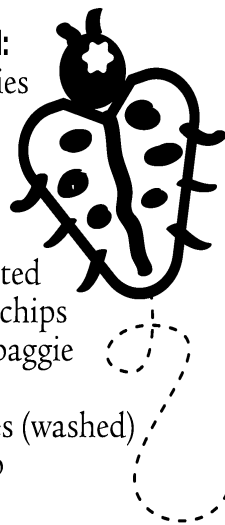

FRUIT LADYBUGS
