*For you were called to freedom, brothers and sisters, only do not use your freedom as an opportunity for self-indulgence, but through love become slaves to one another. For the whole law is summed up in a single commandment, 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself'.*

Galatians 5:13-14



On July 4<sup>th</sup> we gather to celebrate the birthday of our nation, a nation of liberty and freedom. The freedom of the press, of religion, of speech, of living and being who we want to be; are just some of the things that have always made our country great. We will shoot off fireworks and gather in celebration of our nation and the freedom we so often take for granted.

But freedom can also be dangerous. Think about the first time you leave your child home by themselves without a babysitter. They might be just fine, or they might destroy your house. They have been given freedom and that can be used for both good or ill. Sometimes we abuse our freedom to harm our neighbor but Paul encourages us to use our freedom in a different way.

Paul, in writing to the Galatians, talks to them that they are free from sin and the law through the work of Christ. They are saved by faith and not by works and, as such, have freedom. But Paul basically asks: what will you do with your freedom? He encourages them to use their freedom to serve the neighbor, to love one another. Freedom is a gift given to them by God, but a gift that should be used in lifting up the other, not oppressing them.

The same is true in our nation. We can use our freedom of speech to either lift each other up or destroy each other. We have freedom to live as we want, but do we use our freedom to help the poor and needy or to step on them to advance our own wealth and power? Do we use our freedom to call out injustice in the world or do we contribute to that injustice? Do we use our freedom to engage others who might be different from us or do we use it to stay in our own safe space where everyone looks and thinks like we do? Do we use our freedom to fuel hate or to inspire hope?

I think that God in Jesus Christ calls us to use our freedom to help the other, to be a voice of hope and love in the world, to listen and embrace our neighbor. I think we are called to love those who are different from us, even those who worship different from us and have different beliefs than us. The Son, Jesus Christ, has made us free. We should use our freedom to spread God's love in word and deed to all. To all.

I give thanks for our country, for the freedoms we have, and for the opportunity to speak and believe what I want. My hope is that we will all use our freedom not just for ourselves, but for our neighbor as well. For that we can say, "Thanks be to God!" Amen.

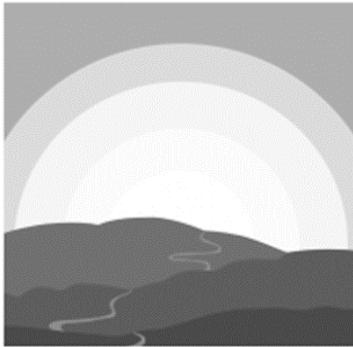

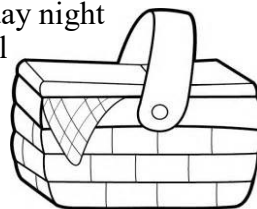

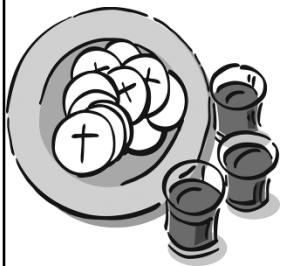

## Narrative Lectionary Stories for June 2017

### June 4: Acts 2:1- 4; Galatians 4:1-7

#### Pentecost

On Pentecost, God sends the Holy Spirit. We receive the Holy Spirit which reminds us of all that Christ has done for us, gathers us into community, and enlightens us with the gifts of forgiveness, life, and salvation.

### June 11: Psalm 100

This is a Psalm of praise, lifting up the Lord's goodness and steadfast love to us. Because of this, we come before the Lord in worship and in gratitude for all that we have received.

### June 18: Psalm 13

This is a Psalm of lament. As Psalm like Psalm 13 helps give us words to talk honestly with the Lord, even in times when we feel abandoned and alone. Laments in the end are faithful expressions of faith because when we cry to Lord we do so trusting that God is able to do something about our suffering.

### June 25: Psalm 23

This is not only the most famous Psalm, it might also one of the most famous Bible verses in the world. There is hopefulness in this Psalm with a vision of not only the presence of the Lord in the midst of death, but that goodness, mercy, and salvation are given to us by God.

## Narrative Lectionary Stories for July 2017

### July 2: Psalm 30

Here is a powerful expression of God's ability to restore. There is a mixture of lament and praise, ending with the fact that God turns our "mourning into dancing." In the Lord, the last word is always life.

### July 9: Psalm 150

This Psalm explodes in praise for God. There is a sense of praising God with a sense of wholeness, using every instrument to give thanks and praise to our God.

### July 16: Ephesians 1:1-14

In the introduction to this letter, the writer (most likely a disciple of Paul, not the Apostle Paul himself), gives thanks for the Ephesians and emphasizes their connection as shared heirs of the salvation of Christ and connection as children of God.

### July 23: Ephesians 2:11-22

The church at Ephesus dealt with division between members who were Jewish and those who were Gentile. The writer lifts up that Christ breaks down all divisions and that we are all "citizens with the saints." In our fractured world, this is a message we need to hear as well.

### July 30: Ephesians 4:1-16

We are one in Christ. We have been given gifts to use in ministry for God's glory. This unity comes not because we are the same but because we each have a place and a calling in God's family, using our uniqueness to lift up the whole.
