50TH Anniversary OF THE REFORMATION

On October 31st, millions of children will put on their costumes, grab their buckets or bags, and head out to trick-or-treat on Halloween, collecting candy along the way. But another major event is also going to play out that day; one that we will celebrate on Sunday, October 29th: The **500th ANNIVERSARY OF THE REFORMATION!**

On October 31, 1517, Augustinian monk Martin Luther posted on the door of the Castle Church in Wittenberg, Germany, 95 theses for debate. These 95 sentences would birth what is called the Reformation and change the world religiously, politically, economically, and more. We are still feeling the effects of the Reformation today.



We are who we are as a church because of what Martin Luther did. Our Christian denomination is named after him after all. But what is more important is the foundation of who we are. Martin Luther saw in scripture that we are saved by grace through faith and not by our works. We are saved by what Christ has done, not what we have done, and because we are saved we have been freed from sin, death, and the devil to live and serve our neighbor. We no longer worry about our own salvation but rather how to live out our faith in the world.

It is appropriate and important that we celebrate this important occasion. Just as we lifted up the 100th anniversary of our congregation or might go out with your spouse for your wedding anniversary, taking a moment to remember and give thanks is important. It reminds us of who we are, of what is at the core of our mission and ministry.



I hope you will join us as we celebrate this important occasion. And on October 31st, in the midst of handing out candy on Halloween; (and me in a Packers jersey. *Thanks Trinity*) take a moment to give thanks to the Lord for inspiring Martin Luther to post those 95 theses all those years ago. And maybe even sing a few bars of his most famous hymn, "A Mighty Fortress is Our God." Thanks be to God!

Narrative Lectionary Stories for October 2017

October 1: 1 Exodus 2:23-25; 3:1-15; 4:10-17 **God's Name Revealed**

In the midst of the slavery of God's people, God provides someone to bring them out of slavery into freedom: Moses. In doing so, God also provides to Moses God's own name that the Israelites would trust in Moses and also promises to give Moses the words he will need to lead his people to freedom.

October 8: Exodus 16:1-18 **God Provides Manna**

Despite the complaints of those God has just freed from bondage, God does not forget the needs of the Israelites. God provides "bread from heaven" that doesn't just satisfy their hunger, but goes above and beyond their need, showing them and us that God blesses us extravagantly.

October 15: 1 Samuel 3:1-21 **God Calls Samuel**

Samuel doesn't understand that God is calling him, but Eli does. For us, God calls every day for us to live as disciples in the world, to use our gifts for the glory of God. Our ears need to be open to hear that call to answer as Samuel was advised to, "speak, for your servant is listening."

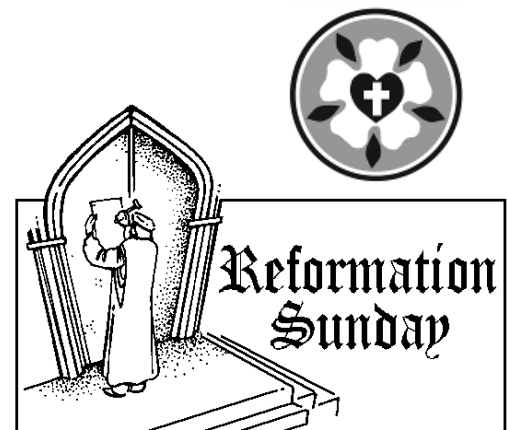
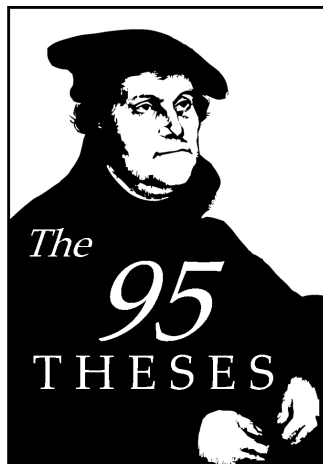
October 22: 1 Samuel 16:1-13 (Confirmation Sunday) **God Calls David**

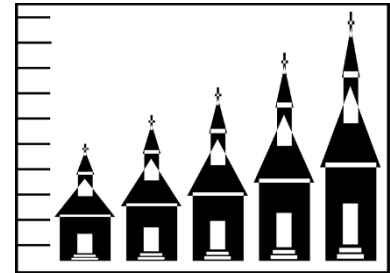

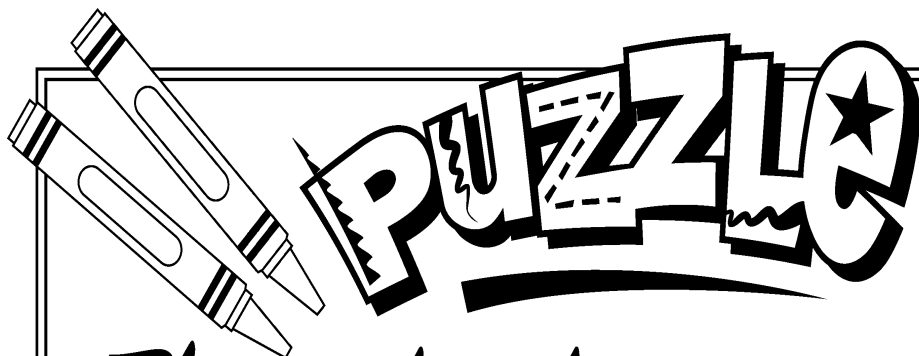

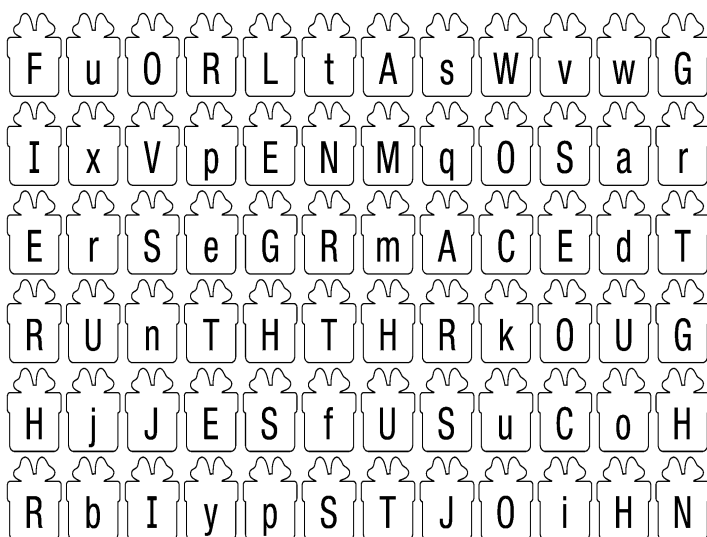
