September 3: 1 Samuel 21:1-9; Matthew 12:1-8 Communion

September 10: Genesis 1:1—2:4a Creation by the Word

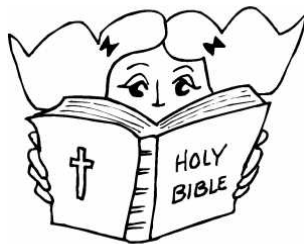

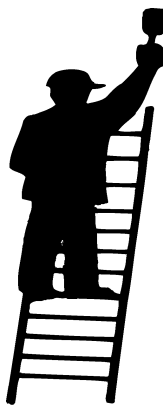
Update Painting and Carpeting Church

APPLE SNACKS



These healthy chips make a yummy back-to-school snack.

What you need:

- 4 apples, cored and cut into 1/8" rings
- Large bowl
- Spoon
