## **GOOD NEWS**



As a New Year dawns, it is a great moment to make changes in your life. After all, that is what New Year's Resolutions are all about. Change. Doing something different; trying something new.

Here at Trinity, as the New Year begins, we are going to be trying something new, something that will affect the entire congregation. We are going to be trying this change in order to help you use your gifts for the sake of God's ministry here at Trinity and in service to others.

We will be dividing the congregation into Service Groups. Each family will be placed in a service group for a three month period: Winter (January-March), Spring (April-June), Summer (July-September), and Fall (October-December). During that three month time, all readers, greeters, ushers, altar guild members, and funeral servers will come from that month. We will be asking two or three people to serve as communicators for funerals and to be willing to gather the volunteers needed when a funeral arises.

Now, for big events, like Potato Pancake, Lefse, Smelt Feed, etc; these events, as well as work days, will be staffed by the entire congregation as before. Fellowship will still be served and staffed in the same way as well. As of now, things like snow shoveling, gardening, and lawn mowing will stay the same as well. If we end up having a large amount of funerals during a particular period, we may call upon another service group to help.

For this year, you will be assigned to a service group and that list will be published in the February edition of the *Good News*. In future years, we may be asking you for your preferences in what service group you want to serve in.

Again, the goal of this is to increase participation and leadership in the activities of Trinity Lutheran Church. We have so many people who want to serve and help but haven't. Maybe they don't know how to volunteer or they don't want to step on anyone's toes. Maybe they have been waiting to be asked, to know that they are valued and important. Maybe they have just fallen through the cracks. No matter what the reason, we hope that this will allow everyone a chance to use their gifts for God's glory.

This reorganization was first taken to the 'Women of Trinity' for input and it was presented to the Church Council at their December meeting. Both groups heartily endorsed this change. Please know that there will be growing pains and things that will need to be adjusted as we move forward. But most especially, I hope that you will pray and think about the ways you can serve Trinity in this New Year.

## Narrative Lectionary Stories for January 2014

#### January 5: John 1:35-51 John Baptizes

The book of John begins with John's testimony about Jesus. John was preaching repentance and baptizing in the wilderness when Jesus began his ministry. Some of John's followers began following Jesus. A key point in today's reading came when new followers asked Jesus, "Where are you staying?" or "abiding"? In the reading, Jesus invited a number of disciples to follow and abide with him. The more time people spend together, the more they begin to emulate one another. By abiding with Jesus, the disciples were being invited to learn to emulate Jesus in a most intimate way. We too, can emulate Jesus in intimate ways when we abide with him.

## January 12: John 2:1-11 Wedding at Cana

In today's reading, Jesus was at a wedding celebration with his mother shortly after beginning to gather his first disciples. He had not yet done any miracles or teachings. When the wine ran out, Jesus' mother (unnamed in the Gospel of John) saw an opportunity for Jesus to perform a miracle, thereby beginning his public ministry. This event, and the event of Jesus' death, are the only two places where the Gospel of John mentions Jesus' mother, making her presence bookends to his public ministry. At the wedding, Jesus helped the hosting family honor the guests by serving good wine throughout the entire celebration.

## January 19: John 2:13-25 Jesus Cleanses the Temple

In the Gospel of John, the cleansing of the temple was Jesus' first act once his ministry began. (In the other three gospels, it happened just before his crucifixion.) In John's gospel, Jesus used signs to point toward God, always redirecting people's attention away from himself, and toward God in heaven. When Jesus overturned the tables, the Jews asked him for a sign to show that he had authority to do what he had done. They didn't realize that Jesus was already beginning to perform signs that God had sent Jesus to reveal God to the people.

## January 26: John 3:1-21 Jesus and Nicodemus

Nicodemus likely came by night so he wouldn't be seen by others. Night-time also symbolized unbelief, as the light symbolized belief. Nicodemus came with questions and doubts about Jesus, his authority, and his message. Nicodemus's lack of understanding about being "born from above" or "born again" might mirror our own. What does it mean to be born again? Our Christian heritage of baptism can place a layer of understanding, as we understand baptism as giving new life through water and Spirit. But perhaps it is okay to let the ambiguous language hold some mystery.

# Creation [ALEIDISCOPE

Make this fun craft to remember what our heavenly Creator made.  $\Lambda \circ \mathcal{L}$ 

## What you need:

- Adult help
- Tall chip can with lid
- Hammer and nail
- Acrylic paint; paintbrush
- Water, glitter, white glue o
- Colored tissue paper
- Stronger craft glue (not hot glue)
- Star stickers or sequins
- Two 4" x 5" pieces of clear Con-Tact paper •
- Scissors; pencil; permanent marker

## What you do:

- In bottom center of can, hammer a hole with a nail. Paint outside of can. Let dry.
- 2. Add glitter and a little water to white glue. With a clean paintbrush, glue tissue paper to bottom outside of lid.
- 3. Add stars to sticky side of Con-Tact paper. Place a matching piece on top, sticky sides together.
- 4. Put craft glue along edge of can opening. Glue Con-Tact paper square over opening. Let dry.
- 5. Place lid on can, over Con-Tact paper. Turn lid to get kaleidoscope effect.
- 6. With marker, write "In the beginning ... " on can.
