- Take a few minutes every day to read the Bible with your child or spend some time in prayer with them. Not only does that open up their heart and mind to the word of God, but when you share that word with them or pray with them, you give them the best faith example they will ever have.
- Even better, bring them to church with you during the summer months (remember we have a half hour service every Wednesday night at 7:30pm besides the Sunday morning worship). Worship is where we get recharged in faith, both kids and adults alike. Even better, it reminds your youth that they are not alone in their faith.

This summer, you have an opportunity to help your child grow. You can help them grow in athletic skill, in education, but most importantly, you can help them grow in faith. I hope you will take advantage of this opportunity to let their faith in Jesus Christ grow and mature this summer.

Narrative Lectionary Stories for May 2014

May 4: Acts 9:1-19

Called into Christ's Service

Saul was among the most notorious and ruthless persecutors of Christians at the time following Jesus' death and resurrection. He was both a Jew and a Roman citizen, which gave him powerful education and status in the world. He was able to use both while he was persecuting Christians, and also after his conversion when he began preaching the word and planting churches throughout the land. His conversion was dramatic and abrupt, occurring along the road while he was on a journey to hunt Christians. His conversion required the participation of the Christian, Ananias. Ananias was also called, and both men were asked to trust one another for the conversion to take place. Both fulfilled their callings, and a powerful ministry was started on that day.

May 11: Acts 16:16-34

Paul and Silas

Paul and Silas traveled, bringing the word of God wherever God sent them. They had spent some time in Philippi, and had converted a business woman named Lydia, who would become one of their financial supporters there. Shortly after her conversion, they encountered the girl with a spirit of divination, which allowed her to see and tell fortunes, for the welfare of her owners. When Paul cast the spirit out of her, he did so in Jesus' name. Only Roman-approved religions were allowed. Judaism was allowed there, but Christianity was not. Paul and Silas were sentenced to prison. While they were in prison they had the opportunity to convert the jailer and his family, which helped them secure a faithful foundation in Philippi.

May 18: Acts 17:16-31

Sermon at Athens

Athens was an important hub of culture, where art, architecture, religion, and philosophy could be celebrated and debated. Public debates were common, and crowds were often drawn toward lively debates where new ideas and thoughts were presented. It was into this atmosphere that Paul spoke about God, the creator of the universe. Hearers would have been more familiar with the concept of smaller gods for more specific things (god of war, god of love). The idea of a singular God of all things would have been foreign. Paul took the opportunity to quote familiar poets and a familiar "unknown god" to grasp their attention and point them toward God, creator, and father of the risen Christ.

May 25: Philippians 1:1-18a Partnership in the Gospel

Paul planted churches throughout his missionary journeys. One of the churches he planted was in Philippi. This letter to the Philippians celebrated their partnership in spreading the gospel through their work in the church. Paul was in prison when he wrote this letter with Timothy. Contrary to what we might expect, Paul was in quite high spirits in prison, having converted a number of the imperial guard, who were elite Roman soldiers charged with protecting the Roman emperor and his family. There were others preaching the gospel who did not agree with Paul's understanding of the gospel. Those disagreements sometimes arose in Paul's writings, as it did here. He addressed the issue, pointing out that it didn't matter why people proclaimed Christ's gospel as long as they proclaimed it.

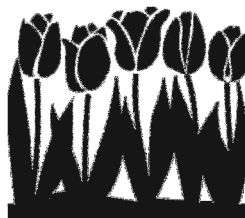

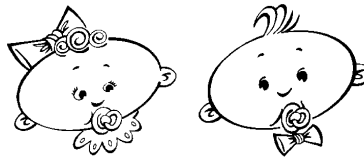
LUTHER WORLD RELIEF

May is "Baby Care Kit" Month

Baby Care Kits are distributed as part of emergency and relief efforts, to be sure, but they are also given out as part of LWR health initiatives to encourage women to seek prenatal care. One such initiative in Mali provided training for local prenatal health care workers, who were given Baby Care Kits to distribute when they assisted with births. These kinds of programs help more babies in rural, poor areas receive a healthy start in life. We hope you will join us in this effort!

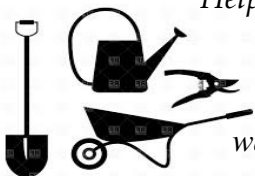

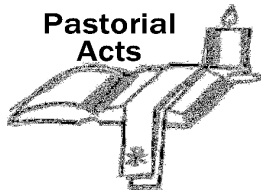

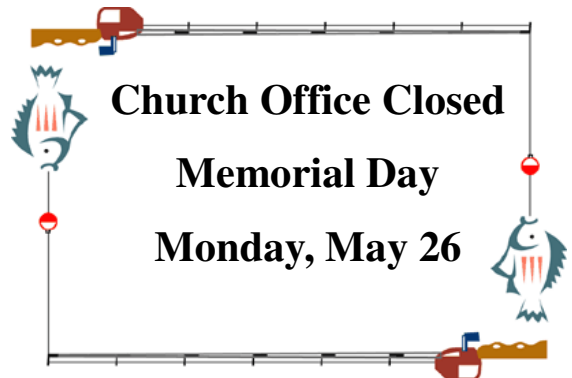

The Birth of Mother's Day



Anna M. Jarvis (1864-1948) loved her mother dearly. It was Miss Jarvis who first suggested a national day to honor all mothers. At a memorial service for her mother on May 10, 1908, Anna gave a carnation, her mother's favorite flower, to each person in attendance. Within a few years, the idea to honor mothers gained popularity, and Mother's Day was soon observed annually in many large cities of the United States.

On May 9, 1914, by an act of congress, President Woodrow Wilson proclaimed the second Sunday of May as Mother's Day. He established the day as a time for "public expression of our love and reverence for the mothers of our country." By then, it had become customary to wear white carnations in honor of departed mothers and red carnations to honor the living. The custom continues to this day.

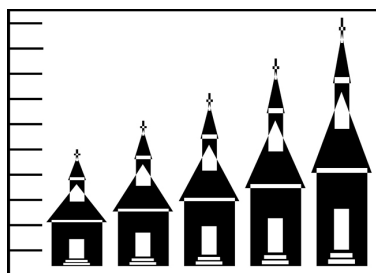

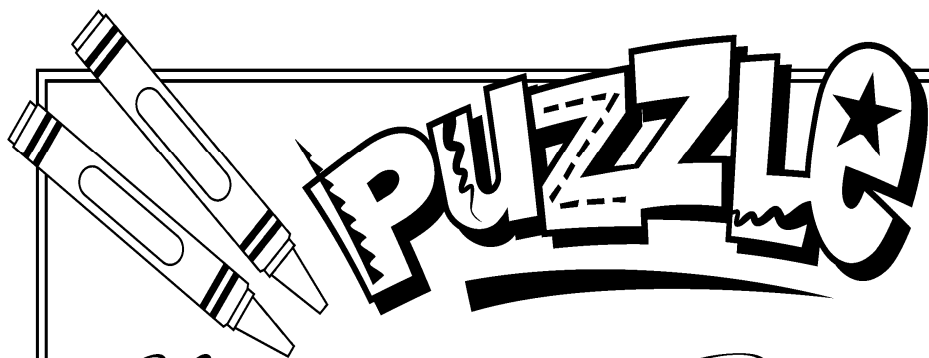

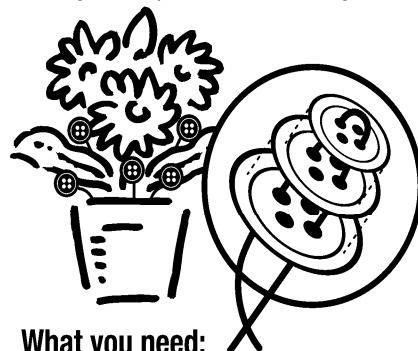

Blooming Button Flowers

For Mother's Day, add a special touch to any houseplant with this easy craft.



What you need:

- A small houseplant with leaves
- Colorful buttons of various sizes
- Green 26-gauge floral wire
- Wire cutters
