God is love, and those who abide in love abide in God, and God abides in them.

1 John 4:16b

I love the word ABIDE. I mostly encounter it in scripture when I do weddings as it is in one of the most used wedding scriptures-John 15:10*. This word, ABIDE, means *to remain*; and in this verse from 1 John, it tells that when we remain in love, God remains in us, because God is love.

Have you ever thought about how when you show love to someone else, you show them God? Think about that for a second. Every time you tell your child you love them, every time you show your spouse love, you show them God? Every time to show love to someone else, every time you show them kindness, you show them God. Not only that, but you show them Jesus, for God shows his love for us by giving us his one and only Son.

Everywhere we go, we bring God with us. Into our workplaces, into restaurants and bars, to the gas station, the ball field, the cabin and the camper. We bring God with us because we bring love. However, I think we often forget that. We forget that we show people God when we show them ourselves and our love. After all, as 1 John 4:19, "We love because he first loved us."

I challenge you to think that every interaction you have with someone else, whether friend or stranger, is a chance to share God's love for them. Every interaction you have is a chance for God to abide in love and to enter into someone's heart.

May we always ABIDE in God's love and may we always remember that we are first loved by God through the death and resurrection of our Savior Jesus Christ. And may we be bold to share that love with others, so that they might come to abide in God's love as well.

PINE RIDGE MISSION TRIP

Ten youth and three adults headed out on July 5th for our first ever mission trip, a trip to Wanblee, SD, and the Pine Ridge Indian Reservation. On the 5th we traveled to Rapid City, SD, with a quick stop at Wall Drug in Wall, SD. After enjoying the pool and a good nights sleep, we headed out to visit Mount Rushmore. We enjoyed the memorial, museum, visitor's center, and the President's Trail.

After Mount Rushmore we headed out on Highway 44 through the southern part of Black Hills National Park. We went north to Interior and took some stops to explore the Black Hills and their majestic beauty. From there, we headed out to Wanblee, SD, where we were the first group to arrive for the week. They set us up in the TNT building (Teens Need Teens), a YMCA-like building that the community uses. We set up our air mattresses in our sleeping quarters and then waited for the other groups to arrive. Two other church groups, a Baptist group from Two Harbors, MN, and a United Church of Christ group from Medfield, MA, swelled our group total to 75. We met our Youthworks staff, had dinner, and had orientation meetings, including discussion about the shower schedule and the fact that showers were so cold, you thought they piped the water in from Lake Superior. We ended the night with Club (worship) and church group time before putting our heads on our air mattresses and dreaming.

Our kids were dived into three different work crews with kids from the other churches. Peyton, Marki, Nik, and Robbie were with PB; Jake, Wyatt, Katie, and Megan were with John, and Rachel and Tori were with Heidi. For PB's crew (called Invasion) and John's crew (called Wicked), they would work on work projects the first two days, then do Kids Club the next two (Kids Club is a day camp for the youth of Wanblee). Heidi's crew had the opposite schedule.

Throughout the week, the work crews painted, mixed paint, cleaned the TNT gym floor, cleaned the town dump so it could avoid a fine, and worked on a trailer home painting, installing insulation, skirting, filling in a trench, painting, and installing a bathroom. For Kids Club, our youth got a chance to make a connection with a local youth while playing games, reading books, doing crafts, or just hanging out. On Thursday, a group from South Dakota Youth and Family Services led a family fun day at TNT that we worked at. It was a cool community event with all sorts of activity and food.

Each night we had a different activity. On Monday night, we went into the majestic Badlands. On Tuesday, a local resident named Jerome talked to us about life on the reservation and the Lakota people. Wednesday we went to a 38 foot cross in the Badlands and had Club. On Thursday there was a community cookout. After each activity, we had Club and then church group time.

We saw many images of poverty and the stories of many of the kids we encountered were tragic and harrowing. Suicide, abuse, problems with drugs and alcohol are all every day occurrences on the reservation. Unemployment is at 85%. There is much that needs to be done and our hope was that we made a positive impact no matter how small it was.

Friday morning we got up, cleaned, and left with a stop at the Missouri River on the way back. Though we were glad to get back home, we left with a piece of ourselves back in Wanblee, with the new friends we made, and a faith that was stronger. The Mission Trip youth will be presenting about their journey on Sunday, September 7th, during worship. Thank you for your support of the Mission Trip youth!
