GOOD NEWS

They say that the two things that people are most focused on, the two things that mean the most to people when you get right down to the nitty gritty is **PURPOSE** and **IDENTITY**. What are you doing with your life (your actions, motivations, dreams, goals, vocation, etc) and who you are as an individual and as part of the larger world. **Purpose** and **IDENTITY**.

We spend a lot of time on the first one, **OUR PURPOSE**. We consult self-help books, go to seminars, and broad over "What do I want to be when I grow up?" But we often don't spend that much time on our **IDENTITY**. Sure, we might know our ethnic heritage or take pride in our hometown or the state where we are born. We will proudly wave the flag and call ourselves American and we might have some vague sense of what all that means. But when we think about who we are as disciples of Jesus Christ, and as Lutheran disciples of Jesus Christ, we might not have any clue, or a very rudimentary clue at that.

As a child, I had no idea what it meant to be a Lutheran. As a high schooler I barely had an idea. Even in college, and even as I thought about becoming a pastor (hey look **PURPOSE**), I still didn't really know. I'm sure at some point I had learned it, but I had forgotten. I was a Lutheran because my parents were, my grandparents, and my great-grandparents and so on. I bet the same is true for many of you. We have forgotten, or didn't even know, what it means to be Lutheran.

But to know what it means to be Lutheran ties right into those big questions of purpose and identity. Because being Lutheran means that we look at the world, ourselves, our community, our faith, and our lives in a particular way. Being Lutheran means that we have a particular lens on the world, one informed by scripture, by the teachings and writings of Martin Luther (who is that? you might have just thought), and by all those Lutherans that have gone before us. Knowing that lens, about what it means to be Lutheran, can be extremely helpful as we think about the questions of **PURPOSE** and **IDENTITY** for ourselves.

In Lent, we are going to talk about "Being Lutheran-What Does This Mean?" We are going to look at who Martin Luther was, the central focus of Lutheran theology and thought, and how that theology and thought gives us a particular and unique way at viewing faith, work, and life. Because it is unique, it is different, and I think you will find that it has shaped you, and will continue to shape you, more than you have ever realized.


So join us starting every Wednesday night at 7pm to hear what it is to be Lutheran. You just might be surprised at what you find!



Narrative Lectionary Stories for February 2015

February 1: Matthew 6:7-21 Treasure in Heaven

In any culture and in any time, the accumulation of more is a temptation. The religious leaders of Jesus' day professed to live rightly, praying publically eloquent prayers and acquiring praise and accolades for their "righteousness." Their desire for more was misplaced, as their desires could only be met with material goods or praise from others. Jesus didn't want empty words or rituals. Jesus wanted action. He wanted people to treat each other with kindness and generosity, and to speak with God honestly and authentically. Jesus encouraged people to seek treasure that would last far beyond the years on this earth. He showed that investing in God would pay far more dividends than investing in anything we can receive in this world.

February 8: Matthew 14:13-33 The Feeding of the 5,000

Miracles and healings were not unusual in Jesus' day. Many prophets and healers were able to perform them. The miracles and healings of Jesus drew attention to Jesus, and Jesus used those opportunities to tell people how much God loved them. What set Jesus apart from other miracle workers and healers was that he genuinely had been given the authority to perform them in God's name. Jesus was also the only one ever to be raised from the dead. The interactions between Jesus and his disciples is of interest in these accounts. First, Jesus' initial command to them was to feed the crowds themselves. Perhaps he was trying to tell them that they had it within them to call upon God for help in performing such a miracle. Second, Jesus invited Peter to walk on the water with him. In both stories, Jesus tried to show that the disciples had been given God's authority to perform miracles, to preach, teach, and heal, just as he himself was doing.

February 15: Matthew 16:24—17:8 Bearing the Cross

As disciples of Jesus Christ, we cannot seek life in this world through our own selfish desires. Only losing our life for Jesus sake, setting aside our own selfishness, can we really find life. Here, in this section, does Jesus show his true nature. In the Transfiguration, he will show his divinity and his power. But it is through the cross, and his command to take up our own cross, that Jesus shows his true power as the Son of God.

February 22: Matthew 18:15-35 Forgiveness

In these three sections, Jesus teaches us about dealing with sin and forgiveness. Forgiveness is to be total and full, even to be above and beyond. After all, God forgives our sin which are far greater than any sin against us we refuse to forgive. We are called to extend the mercy and forgiveness we have received from God to others, otherwise we reject the
