GOOD NEWS

I like to call March the "in-between month." It is just a weird month. When March hits, we start thinking about spring and how it is around the corner yet we average over eight inches of snow in March. Baseball season isn't quite here but spring training is in full force. Basketball is winding down as is the hockey season. We are in the midst of Lent with Easter coming up fast but we aren't there yet. Snowbirds are still away but some start to trickle back. It is just an "in-between" month.

However, we live our lives "in-between" every day. One of the major themes of Martin Luther's theology, otherwise known as thinking about God and the Christian life, is that we are both saints and sinners. We are all sinners because we call sin. It is part of our nature. It is part of who we are as people. No matter how hard we try, we will do wrong actions, have wrong thoughts, against God, our neighbors, and ourselves. Because of this, we are sinners.

Yet, at the exact same time, we are saints, saved by the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ by the grace of God. As baptized children of God, we are saved by the grace of God, freely given to us through faith. Because of this, we are made righteous and every day we die to sin and rise to newness of life. So we are saints. Yet, we still sin, and so we live as Christians in a tension, in an "in-between" between saint and sinner.

We call this a paradox and it can be hard to live in such a way. We like absolutes. We like black and white. We want to be able to point out someone and say, "They are a sinner. That one is a saint." But life is often a struggle, often is a war between our two natures. Paul puts it well in Romans 7:15 *I do not understand my own actions. For I do not do what I want, but I do the very thing I hate.* But later he will say, a few verses later, Who will rescue me from the body of death? Thanks be to God through Jesus Christ our Lord.

The good news for us is that, in the end, by the grace and mercy of Jesus Christ, our God sees us as saints, washed clean by the blood of his only Son. For though there is a war between our two natures of sinner and saint, in the end the war has already been won by Jesus Christ. As we live in this "in-between" time, we know that Christ will be with us to help us and give us strength as we struggle with our sinfulness and also to help us remember that we have been made saints.

For that we can say, "Thanks be to God!" Amen.



Narrative Lectionary Stories for March 2015

March 1: Matthew 20:1-16 Laborers in the Vineyard

Our sense of fairness is challenged in this parable. Many of us have been raised to believe we get what we earn. To imagine someone else might receive what we receive for having earned far less challenges our sensibilities. But what if we are not the laborer who has earned a day's wage? What if we are the laborer who cannot possibly work hard enough or long enough to earn a day's wage? Perhaps Jesus was teaching here that God offers love more abundantly than anyone can possibly earn.

March 8: Matthew 22:1-14 Parable of the Wedding Banquet

The king in the parable of the wedding banquet was a generous king, but also one who refused to be taken advantage of. Initially he invited family and friends to the banquet, but they would not come. This may have been a parallel to the Jewish leaders who refused to walk in God's ways, even as they were claiming to do just that. The king then invited everyone to come, perhaps an open invitation from God to come into God's kingdom. A twist near the end shows one man, improperly dressed for the banquet, thrown out of the party. This may have been to indicate that God's people were expected to behave in a manner fitting of guests of the king; to treat one another with kindness and respect.

March 15: Matthew 25:1-13 Parable of the Bridesmaids

In following the theme of abundant invitation and grace of the past few weeks, this story moves now to the expected response to such an invitation. The bridesmaids who came prepared ultimately were invited into the banquet. Those who came unprepared missed the opportunity. This suggests that we come to God's house and work in God's world with attention, intentionality, and respect. In both parables, the bridegroom/master were gone for a time, and then returned at an unexpected time. In both instances those waiting were expected to be prepared for the return. The bridesmaids were expected to bring enough oil to last while they waited. The servants were expected to invest what they had been given, so that at the master's return they would have even more to return. Both of these parables expect action on the part of those who wait.


March 22: Matthew 25:31-46 Judgment of the Nations

Jesus told this parable to help people see God in the faces of those we typically would not acknowledge; the hungry, thirsty, poor, naked, sick, and imprisoned. Jesus was intentional about indicating that we are expected to act. Our world has needs, and our actions are crucial to creating in this world an environment that more closely resembles the kingdom God intended for this world.

March 29: Matthew 21:1-13 Palm Sunday/Sunday of the Passion

Jesus entered Jerusalem for the last time, venerated and adored as the king who would redeem Israel and save her from the oppression of Rome. The people had no way of knowing that Jesus' purpose was much greater; to save people from sin and death. Many things in this story indicated that the people were celebrating Jesus as a king. The donkey and the colt, the spreading of cloaks and the branches were all signs of royalty. The people shouted, "Hosanna!" which means "save, rescue, savior." They acknowledged Jesus as a prophet, which meant that his actions were directed and blessed by God. A good king would protect the people from harm, provide basic human needs (food, shelter, safety) for his kingdom, and rule with justice.



REPENT - A WORTHY WORD FOR LENT

What pops into your mind when you hear the word "repent"? Is it a dark and somber word for you, perhaps reminding you of John the Baptist's shouting for people to repent and be baptized?

What does the word "repent" mean anyway? Literally, it means to stop the way one is going, turn around, and then walk in the opposite direction. It refers to turning away from sin and shallow living and to begin walking through life following God's direction.

Lent, which begins on Ash Wednesday is an opportunity to check our spiritual condition, to repent and to walk more faithfully with our Lord.






