



One of my favorite verses is from Matthew 28:20, which you see above. There is such a promise that wherever we go, Jesus is with us. Think about that phrase: wherever we go. Sometimes it is hard to remember to look for Jesus wherever we are. Do we tend to look at Jesus in our house? At our desk? In the break room at work? At the gas station? In the tractor or on the assembly line or in the grocery store or at Wal-Mart or at the camper or in the boat?

Jesus is in all those places and Jesus is working in all those places. Loving you, caring for you, supporting you, reminding you that there is always Good News because our Savior is with us. You are always connected to God's love because Jesus is always with you, whether you are in church or not.

To illustrate this literally, I have a fun challenge for you, one that I stole from my good friend Pastor Kristen Kuempel in Kennewick, WA. She challenged her congregation to take Jesus with them everywhere they went during the summer by, literally, taking Jesus with them.

On the next page is "Flat Jesus." I encourage you to cut out "Flat Jesus", decorate him (a great activity to do with your kids), and take him with you from now until September 13<sup>th</sup>. Along the way, take pictures of the places you take "Flat Jesus". Post them on mine or Trinity Lutheran's Facebook wall or text or email them to me. I will take the pictures and make a display of all the places "Flat Jesus" has been.

Most importantly, as you take "Flat Jesus" everywhere, it will remind you of Jesus' promise that he is with you always. Have fun, be creative, and remember that Jesus is always with you!

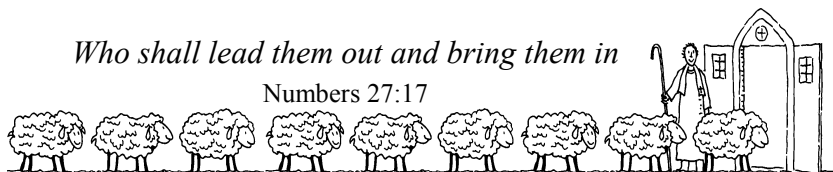

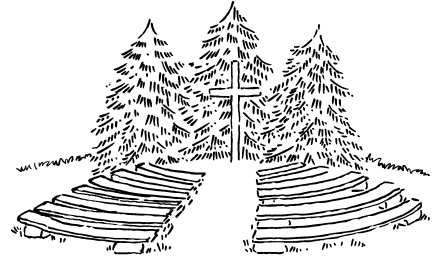

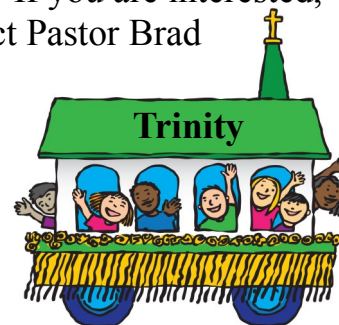
## Pie and Ice Cream Social

## Narrative Lectionary Stories for August 2015

### August 2: The Apostle's Creed

Using various scriptures, we will examine the foundation of what it means to be a Christian, the Apostle's Creed. A creed is a statement of belief and we, as a church, acknowledge three: the Nicene Creed, the Athanasian Creed, and the very first creed, the Apostle's Creed. The Creed talks about the three ways we experience our God: as Creator, Savior, and Holy Spirit. The creed talks about what each "person" of the Trinity does and what it means for us.

### August 9: Hebrews 1:1-4

The book of Hebrews is a complicated book that draws on many aspects of the Old Testament and quotes Old Testament scripture prominently throughout the book. Hebrews first talks about how God spoke to the people through the prophets of old, but now speaks through his Son Jesus Christ who has brought about a new covenant which is even better than the first covenant.

### August 16: Hebrews 2:10-18

The book of Hebrews is a complicated book that draws on many aspects of the Old Testament and quotes Old Testament scripture prominently throughout the book. Hebrews first talks about how God spoke to the people through the prophets of old, but now speaks through his Son Jesus Christ who has brought about a new covenant which is even better than the first covenant.

### August 23: Hebrews 4:14—5:10

The book of Hebrews is a complicated book that draws on many aspects of the Old Testament and quotes Old Testament scripture prominently throughout the book. Hebrews first talks about how God spoke to the people through the prophets of old, but now speaks through his Son Jesus Christ who has brought about a new covenant which is even better than the first covenant.

### August 30: Hebrews 9:1-14

The book of Hebrews is a complicated book that draws on many aspects of the Old Testament and quotes Old Testament scripture prominently throughout the book. 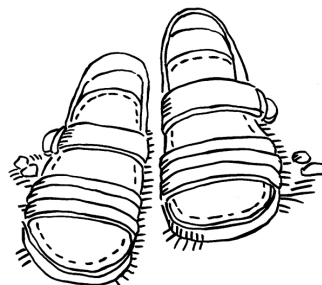

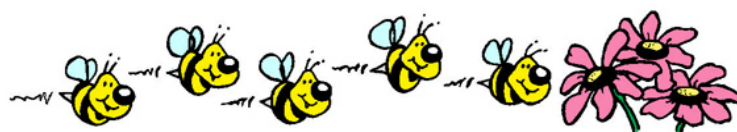

## August is “School Kit” Month

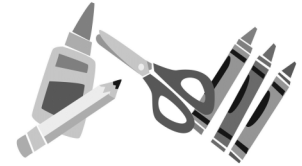
