

Narrative Lectionary Stories for August 2015

August 2: The Apostle's Creed

Using various scriptures, we will examine the foundation of what it means to be a Christian, the Apostle's Creed. A creed is a statement of belief and we, as a church, acknowledge three: the Nicene Creed, the Athanasian Creed, and the very first creed, the Apostle's Creed. The Creed talks about the three ways we experience our God: as Creator, Savior, and Holy Spirit. The creed talks about what each "person" of the Trinity does and what it means for us.

August 9: Hebrews 1:1-4

The book of Hebrews is a complicated book that draws on many aspects of the Old Testament and quotes Old Testament scripture prominently throughout the book. Hebrews first talks about how God spoke to the people through the prophets of old, but now speaks through his Son Jesus Christ who has brought about a new covenant which is even better than the first covenant.

August 16: Hebrews 2:10-18

The book of Hebrews is a complicated book that draws on many aspects of the Old Testament and quotes Old Testament scripture prominently throughout the book. Hebrews first talks about how God spoke to the people through the prophets of old, but now speaks through his Son Jesus Christ who has brought about a new covenant which is even better than the first covenant.

August 23: Hebrews 4:14—5:10

The book of Hebrews is a complicated book that draws on many aspects of the Old Testament and quotes Old Testament scripture prominently throughout the book. Hebrews first talks about how God spoke to the people through the prophets of old, but now speaks through his Son Jesus Christ who has brought about a new covenant which is even better than the first covenant.

August 30: Hebrews 9:1-14

The book of Hebrews is a complicated book that draws on many aspects of the Old Testament and quotes Old Testament scripture prominently throughout the book. Hebrews first talks about how God spoke to the people through the prophets of old, but now speaks through his Son Jesus Christ who has brought about a new covenant which is even better than the first covenant.

Public school is usually free, but in the places where LWR works, even a few required supplies, like pens and paper, may be more than many families can afford. When parents can only afford to send one of their children to school, girls rarely get priority...yet the education level of mothers has the biggest impact on development.
