When I was younger, the one thing in life I didn't want to show was weakness. Turn an ankle playing football? Tape it up and go. Have a friend spread a vicious rumor about you? Laugh it off. Have a girl break your heart? Smile and find a new girl. Have someone you love die? No crying. I remember when my Dad died that I swore to myself that I wouldn't cry and I didn't. Not during the visitation or during the funeral. Even as a young pastor, I felt that to cry, to show weakness in the midst of tragedy, was to betray my calling as a pastor and someone who was there to support others. Even when I get sick, instead of stopping and taking care of myself, I just press on and keep going, minimizing how awful I feel.

We all have weaknesses and times when you do not feel strong. In those moments, our pride often stops us from showing our weakness to others. Our pride stops us from asking for help. I know that is the case with me. I feel like I can handle everything and anything. I play down things that bother me or cause me pain. I bet some of you reading do the same things.

This is why I think these verses are so important. The Holy Spirit helps us in our weakness, not only to admit them, but to turn to the Lord for help. Often we don't know how to pray or to ask for help. Sometimes we are ashamed of our weaknesses. But the Lord knows all about us, the good and the bad. Even more so, the Lord doesn't just listen to our prayers but helps us. The Lord gives us strength, lifts us up, reminds us that we are not alone. The Lord puts people in our lives that also give us strength and remind us that it is ok to be weak. It is ok to show our weaknesses because, after all, we all have them. When we allow ourselves to be vulnerable, we invite others into our story and to be part of our lives.

I now don't worry about showing my weaknesses as much. I still have trouble asking for help, but I don't worry about if I cry in front of others or turning to the Lord in times of weakness to ask for strength. For I know that the Spirit will intercede for me, not only giving me strength but putting people in my life who lift me up and help me get through my times of weakness.

In your times of weakness, trust and turn to the Lord, knowing that Jesus Christ is there for you. For that we can say, "Thanks be to God!"

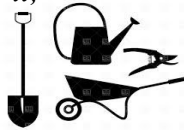
Lawn Mowers & Gardeners Needed

Narrative Lectionary Stories for August 2017

August 6: Ephesians 6:10-20

God clothes us with armor so that we might be able to withstand all that life throws at us. But we must remember that this armor doesn't come from us. It comes from the Lord who gives it so that we would be able to stand firm in faith.

August 13: Acts 2:37-42 Baptism

We begin a month looking at the two means of grace that we call sacraments, Baptism and Holy Communion. In our story from Acts, we see the first large baptism right after the Holy Spirit is poured out on Pentecost. In Baptism, we receive the Spirit and are marked with the cross of Christ forever.

August 20: Romans 6:1-11

Baptism is not just a one time event. It is a daily thing, for every day we die and rise with Christ anew. Every day our sinful-self dies and a new self rises, freed from and death to live boldly as a child of God. As it says in verse 11, *you also must consider yourselves dead to sin and alive to God in Christ Jesus*. This comes through baptism.

August 27: 1 Corinthians 11:17-34

We begin our look at Holy Communion, also known as the Lord's Supper or Eucharist, with Paul talking to the Corinthians about abuses at the Lord's Supper and reminds them of what he received from the Lord and what he passed onto them, that *as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes*.

Christian life consists of faith and charity.



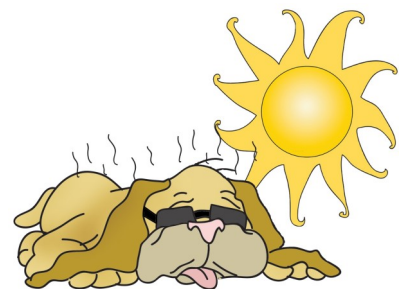
