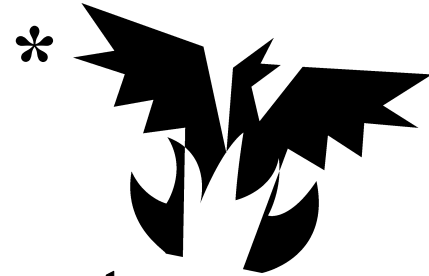



I have been a part of a lot of small group sessions where you have to go around the room and describe yourself. You might have to say where you are from, what you do, maybe your favorite candy bar or movie. It can be a little strange, trying to tell strangers who you are in just a few words. It is like being on a first date where you spend a lot of time just trying to show the other who you are and figure out who they are, to get a window into that person. You might say something like, "I am from Boyceville," or "I am a pastor," or "I am a bacon expert," just to name a few. These kind of statements tell a stranger about you.

To get a window into just who Jesus is, Jesus uses "I am" statements in the Gospel of John. These statements are a window into who Jesus is and what Jesus does. In Lent this year, we will be taking some time to explore these "I am" statements. What do they say about Jesus? What do they tell us about who Jesus is and what Jesus has come to do? How do these statements give us a window into our Savior and our relationship with Jesus?

Lent is a time to explore our faith and our relationship with Jesus. It is a journey that asks us to take a look at ourselves and our faith. It is a journey that we make with devotion, worship, prayer, and giving. It is a journey that we take together as the body of Christ.

We will gather in worship on Wednesday nights through the Holden Evening Prayer service. Before worship, we will encourage each other around the table as we share meals together. We will serve together through the organizations that will be planning these meals. We will give together through our offerings at those meals and our regular stewardship. And we will learn about Jesus through those "I am" statements and get a window into our Savior who describes himself as our good shepherd, our gate, the light of the world, the vine, the bread of life, and the resurrection and the life.

Narrative Lectionary Stories for February 2018

February 4: John 4:1-42

Woman at the Well

Jesus encounters a Samaritan woman who hasn't led an exemplary life. Even worse, Samaritans were hated by Jews and to talk with one was frowned upon. Yet, Jesus offered this sinner and Samaritan living water, showing that Christ has come for sinners and not for saints, to offer salvation to all who believe in him.

February 11: John 9:1-41

The Man Born Blind

Jesus is the light of the world who brings light to a man born in darkness. Despite the man's testimony, many do not believe in Jesus and remain spiritually blind. Jesus is our light that shows us God's love and grace.

February 14: John 10:1-18

Jesus the Gate and the Shepherd

True love is the willingness to sacrifice for the other. Our Good Shepherd, Jesus Christ, sacrifices his life for ours so that we might be saved. On this day when we remember our mortality, we remember the new life we are given by our shepherd.

February 18: John 11:1-44

Jesus Raises Lazarus

This powerful story reminds us that Jesus knows pain and suffering as he weeps for his friend, that he is the resurrection and the life for all of us and shows us that death has no power over us.

February 25: John 13:1-14

Jesus Washes Feet

This story, often read during Maundy Thursday, shows us Jesus' love for his disciples (and us) and the example of what true servanthood is. It is to put the neighbor first.

Narrative Lectionary Stories for March 2018

March 4: John 18:12-27

Peter's Denial

Peter denies Jesus and is filled with shame. We have often denied our Lord out of fear and doubt. Yet, Jesus never denies us and goes to the cross for us not because we are perfect but because we need forgiveness and salvation.

March 11: John 18:28-40

Jesus and Pilate

Pilate asks, "What is truth?" Pilate is unwilling to see the truth that Jesus is innocent. For us, truth is that Jesus loved us so much that He gives his life for ours.

March 18: John 19:1-16a

Jesus Condemned

The people shout out for Jesus to be crucified. Pilate presents Jesus as a king and the people deny it. But Jesus comes not as an earthly king but as a heavenly one and will show that true power comes not in wealth but in sacrifice and love.

March 25: John 19:16b-37

The Crucified Messiah

Jesus is crucified. His work is finished. The Son of God is dead. But the story is not over. The story is just beginning.
