Jesus sat down, called the twelve, and said to them,
Whoever wants to be first must be last of all and servant of all.
Then he took a little child and put it among them;
and taking it in his arms, he said to them,
Whoever welcomes one such child in my name welcomes me,
and whoever welcomes me welcomes not me but the one who sent me.

Mark 9:35-37

When I first arrived at Trinity sixteen years ago, I had to make a ton of decisions. How did I want to arrange my office? What day off did I want to take? How was I going to teach confirmation?

One of the details I had to figure out happened whenever we had communion. When would I take communion? Would I take it at the start or at the end? I grew up in my home congregation where the servers took communion first. My internship site did that as well. But I made the decision to take it, and give it to our communion servers, at the end. I did it to model a sense of servanthood that we see in the above verses from Mark.

Those verses from Mark 9 is about orienting ourselves. It is about putting others first. It is about welcoming the little child, which represents not just children but all those who are considered the least of society. We are called to be servants.

But it is so easy to be servants only to our own whims and needs instead of the needs of others. It is so easy to be self-serving instead of outward serving. It is easy to be selfish. I know that all too well. Yet, Jesus calls us to a new way of living and of being. To be selfless instead of selfish. To welcome all and serve our neighbor.

At Trinity I'm proud of the fact that we convey that all are welcome here. Everyone can participate, no matter their background, church membership, or any other factor. But we must guard against apathy and self-service. We must guard against waiting for the other person to step up when help is needed or that someone else will give financially so that we don't have too. We have to be careful to not think only of ourselves instead of thinking of our neighbors.

Trinity has been blessed over the years. But in the midst of that blessing, it is easy to get too comfortable, to get apathetic and stop being the vibrant, welcoming, generous, and servant-oriented church that we have been. I challenge you to think of ways in which you can put the other first and be a servant to your neighbor and to the Lord. I challenge you to think of ways that you can boldly welcome people in our midst. I challenge you to think about your stewardship; the use of your time, talent, and money for the sake of this ministry and of your neighbor.

And I challenge you to remember the Good News that the Son of God, Jesus Christ, became a servant for all us sinners and has won for us eternal life through his death and resurrection. May we follow Christ's example and be servants every day.

“**He leads me beside still waters ...**” Although we often prefer noisy distractions, God knows we need quiet to hear him and have our souls restored.

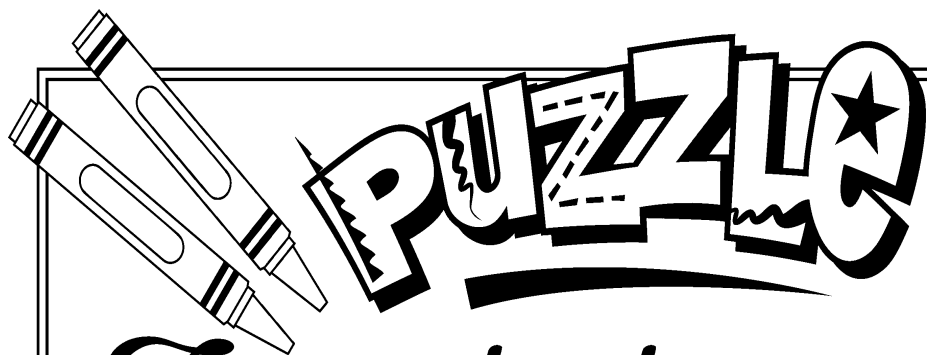

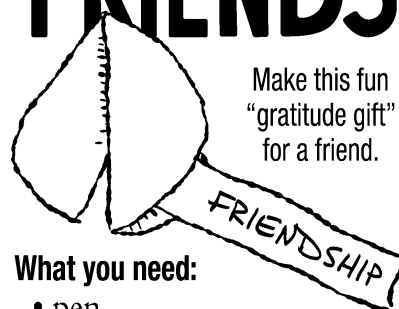
