





Communion Bread Recipe 1 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> Cups White Flour 1 tsp. Baking Soda <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> Cup Whole Wheat Flour

3 Tbsp. Sugar

Add and mix 3 tbsp. oil and <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> cup water into dry ingredients. Divide into four parts. Knead each one on floured surface. Form 5" circles about <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" thick. Score tops with fork or pizza cutter before baking.

Bake 10-12 minutes @350 Serves approx. 75






