Communion Bread Recipe

1 ½ Cups White Flour
1 tsp. Baking Soda
½ Cup Whole Wheat Flour
3 Tbsp. Sugar

Add and mix 3 tbsp. oil and ¾ cup water into dry ingredients. Divide into four parts. Knead each one on floured surface. Form 5" circles about ½" thick. Score tops with fork or pizza cutter before baking.

Bake 10-12 minutes @350
Serves approx. 75

The Passion Play Tour 2020 and In The Footsteps Of Martin Luther

Join Elizabeth Bartsch, Assistant to the Bishop-Admin-Northwest Synod of Wisconsin as we travel to Germany and Austria and visit major Martin Luther sites, encounter the 'Dachau Concentration Camp', visit 'Sound of Music' sites, historic castles, and beautiful landmarks. The highlight will be experiencing the unique 'Passion Play' performed by villagers every ten years. As we travel with tour guide, David Harper, we will be deeply rooted in the stories of these cities, discovering the history that has shaped the villagers and residents in and around the Bavarian Alps for hundreds of years.

Travel dates are July 8-19, 2020. 'Passion Play' organizers require a \$300 deposit, due by March 10, 2019 to secure your spot. Package price of \$5,192 (per person, double occupancy) includes airfare from Minneapolis, 11 days private tour coach transportation, 10 nights in superior tourist class / first class hotels, most meals and tour destination admission fees. 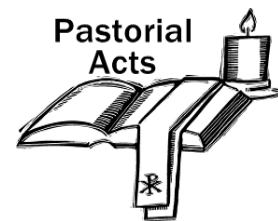

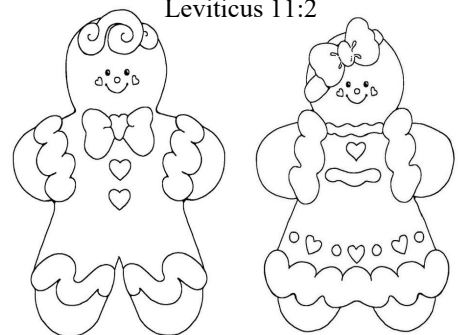

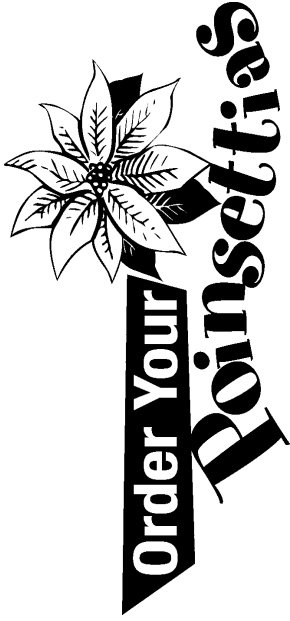
