



Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and there are varieties of services, but the same Lord; and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who activates all of them in everyone. To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good. To one is given through the Spirit the utterance of wisdom, and to another the utterance of knowledge according to the same Spirit, to another faith by the same Spirit, to another gifts of healing by the one Spirit, to another the working of miracles, to another prophecy, to another the discernment of spirits, to another various kinds of tongues, to another the interpretation of tongues. All these are activated by one and the same Spirit, who allots to each one individually just as the Spirit chooses.

1 Corinthians 12:4-11



When I played basketball in high school, and frankly ever since, I knew that I was no superstar. I knew that I wasn't going to be the one who was going to score 20 points or be a lockdown defender or the point guard running the show. Those were not my gifts or abilities. But I did know what I was good at. I was good at setting picks to help my teammates get open. I was good at taking chargers, of sacrificing myself for the sake of the team (Proof: as a junior on varsity I averaged less than five minutes a game but led the team in charges). I knew that I could hit a spot up three and that I was pretty good at just running around like a maniac in a press defense for a few minutes. Those were my gifts and that was my role and I was happy and content to do what I could.

This body of Christ we call the church is like a team. We all have our gifts and abilities that we can use to help the team succeed. All of these gifts are given to us by the Holy Spirit so that we might build up the common good, the body of Christ, and help the ministry of Trinity Lutheran Church succeed. But I think that we often think we have no gifts or no role. We might see someone who is like the leading scorer on the basketball team and think that I can't do that, so why should I bother? We might see someone who is that point guard and think I can't do that so the team can't use me. And so we quit, or stop, or think that our gifts are unimportant. But that is not true. For this ministry to succeed, for the Gospel of Jesus Christ to be proclaimed, we need every single person using the gifts God has given them for the sake of this ministry.

Each one of you has gifts given by the Holy Spirit for the common good and for the benefit of Trinity. So ask yourself two questions:

- 1.) What are my gifts? What skills, abilities, time, passions do I have that the Lord can use?
- 2.) Will I be willing to get off the bench to use them?

Every single person in this congregation is important and has something to offer for this greater ministry. Every single one of you are called by the Holy Spirit to be part of this team we call Trinity Lutheran Church. You do not have to be LeBron James on this team to make a difference. Just be willing to answer the call to use your gifts to lift up this ministry and help it grow.

For that we can say, "Thanks be to God!" Amen.

Peeling started early on **Tuesday**. By the end of the day, 600 pounds of potatoes had been peeled, ground and mixed. It was packed into tubs and stored in the fridge for the next day!

Wednesday and **Thursday** they came again! Our people came to: mix, make balls, roll balls, flip and carry lefse, count, direct, bag, label, stack, wash dishes, help with food, support and guide. We had produced over 1,842 sheets of lefse! We had 614 bags to sell!

On **Friday** the bags were sealed shut and prepped for the Spirit of Christmas!

Saturday was full of excitement with the Lefse and Bake Sale! The sale raised almost \$4,000 to help WELCA support the many groups at Trinity and beyond.

All this was accomplished with Christmas music, joy, and laughter!



As an ordained minister, Fred Rogers harnessed the power of television to tell children they were loved and to show them how to love others. In *You Are Special*, he writes, “When we love a person, we accept him or her exactly as is: the lovely with the unlovely, the strong along with the fearful, the true mixed in with the façade, and of course, the only way we can do it is by accepting ourselves that way.”

In a review of the touching documentary *Won't You Be My Neighbor?* a writer for *Variety* notes: “Rogers’ real secret was ... that the call to love your neighbor as yourself isn’t a slogan to hang in your kitchen with flowers around it, it’s a decision you make at every moment, to view every man, woman and child on earth as your neighbor. If you don’t see and feel that, and act on it, then you’re just another narcissist with a kitchen slogan.”

Last October, when a synagogue shooting shattered the peace of Rogers’ real-life former neighborhood, residents of all religions embraced one another as neighbors. Afterward, the Fred Rogers Center stated, “We long for a day when there is no more tragedy born from hatred.”






What you need:
