



“Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying,  
‘Whom shall I send, and who will go for us?’  
And I said, ‘Here am I; send me!’

Isaiah 6:8

As August starts, I begin my 17<sup>th</sup> year as pastor here at Trinity. I’ve been thinking about this above passage from the prophet Isaiah lately. Some of this is due to the new Isaiah Bible Study that will start this month. This passage occurs during the call of Isaiah to be a prophet and this moment happens right after the Lord cleanses Isaiah from his sin. In my own call story, I have often felt like Isaiah: unworthy and too sinful to be a servant of the Lord. However, due to the grace and mercy of God given to us through the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ, I have been able to answer that call to the best of my ability, resting always on the foundation of grace that has been given to me.

The call to go for the Lord, to be the hands, feet, and voice of Jesus in the world, is one that is not just reserved for us who are called pastors. This call goes out to all of us who believe in Jesus Christ as our Lord and Savior. This call is scary, to share our faith and serve the neighbor. It means putting trust in our Savior and understanding that we might mess up, our message might be rejected, and not everything will go as we hope. But we have faith in our Savior who is working in, with, and through us. We are not alone in our callings but rather walk with others and have the Holy Spirit who walks with us as well.

On our cemetery clean-up day as part of our *God’s Work, Our Hands* service projects, I found myself at the grave OK Hedlund. I thought of the verse he chose for his funeral, Psalm 116:16, which is on a plaque in the kitchen, “O Lord, I am your servant. I am your servant.” We try our best to be servants, knowing that we will not be perfect but trusting in the perfect love and grace given to us by Jesus. We need to do a better job of forgiving ourselves for our mistakes and forgiving each other when they make a mistake. Because, after all, we are servants following God’s call the best we can.

I still feel very blessed to be a servant of the Lord and to be pastor of Trinity. As summer comes to an end, take a few moments to think about that question at the top: “Whom shall I send, and who will go for us?” Think about the call you have from the Lord to be a servant. How will you serve? How will you answer that call? As you discern that, remember that you are a forgiven, loved, and gifted child of God. You are not called to be perfect. You are called to be a servant. And for that we can say, “Thanks be to God!”

Crowfoot, a chief of the Siksika First Nation, was a prominent Native American in the late 1800s. The brave warrior offered the following insight into the brevity and wonder of life:

It is the little shadow, which runs across the grass  
And loses itself in the sunset.

Crowfoot's observations reflect the theme of Psalm 90. Verse 4 reads: "For a thousand years in your sight are like yesterday when it is past, or like a watch in the night." The prayer in verse 12 is that we would keep our earthly life in proper perspective: "Teach us to count our days that we may gain a wise heart."
