
We are often searching for direction in life, of where we think we should go. We often also find ourselves lost, seeming to be in a maze that we can't escape of self-doubt, suffering, grief, sin and pain. It can seem like every choice we make is the wrong one and that we go ever into the darkness.

No matter what maze you find yourself, corn or otherwise, you have a Savior who is leading you and the word of God to guide you. For that we can say, "Thanks be to God!"
