Communion Bread Recipe

1 1/2 C. White Flour
1 tsp. Baking Soda
1/2 C. Whole Wheat Flour
3 Tbsp. Sugar

Add and mix 3 tbsp. oil and 3/4 cup water into dry ingredients. Divide into four parts. Knead each one on floured surface. Form 5" circles about 1/2" thick. Score tops with fork or pizza cutter before baking.

Bake 10-12 minutes @350

Serves approx. 75
