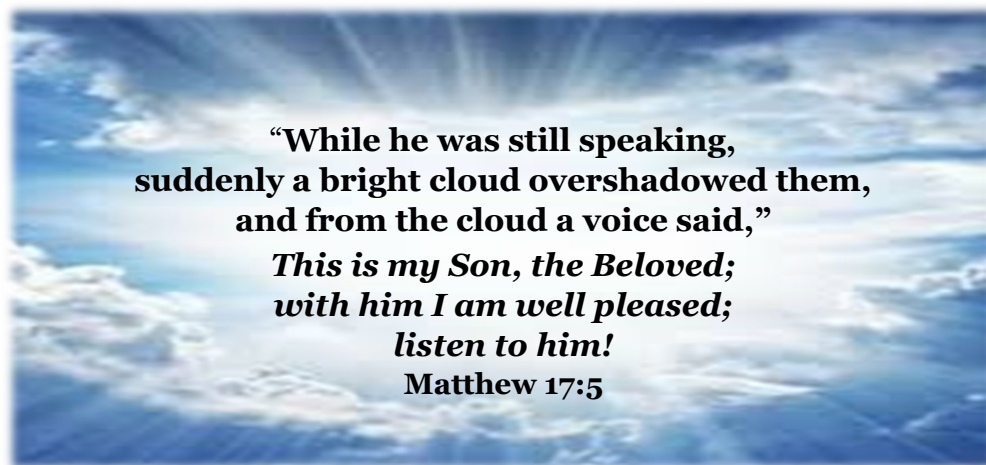

As a person who grew up with attention deficit disorder, I often had a hard time listening (I think Amy might say I still have a hard time listening!). When I should have been listening, my mind often raced from thing to thing. I had to learn to concentrate, to shut out the noise that was in my head so I could concentrate and focus. So I could listen.

In our reading above from Matthew, God tells Peter, James, and John, who are with Jesus on a mountain, to listen to him. These words are also meant for us. We are to listen to the Messiah, the Son of God, our Savior Jesus Christ. However, we so often have so many other voices that make us act like Pastor Brad with ADD. We have a hard time listening. We hear the voices of doubt and suffering, pain and loss. We have the voices of the world that tell us to put ourselves first over our neighbor and that the meaning of life is gaining wealth, power, and fame. We have the voice of the devil that tells us that faith is worthless and that God has forgotten us.

With all these voices, it can be hard to hear the voice of our Savior, reminding us that we are love children of God, forgiven and redeemed. It can be hard to hear Jesus' voice, telling us to love our neighbor as ourselves and that the Lord is there to carry our burdens. It can be hard to hear that the Lord never gives up on us and that we have forgiveness in his name.

But the Lord is speaking to us, every single day. Speaking to us when we pray, worship, and hear or read God's word. The Lord is speaking to us when we gather with others and frankly throughout our days and hours. The Lord is talking to you, today. Listen to him! Hear the sweet words of forgiveness, life, salvation, and hope. Hear the words of life and love.

As we get ready to start the season of Lent, take a few moments to stop and listen. Block out the noise of the world and the voices that seek to take you away from God and hear the Lord speaking to you so that you might be renewed in faith and life.

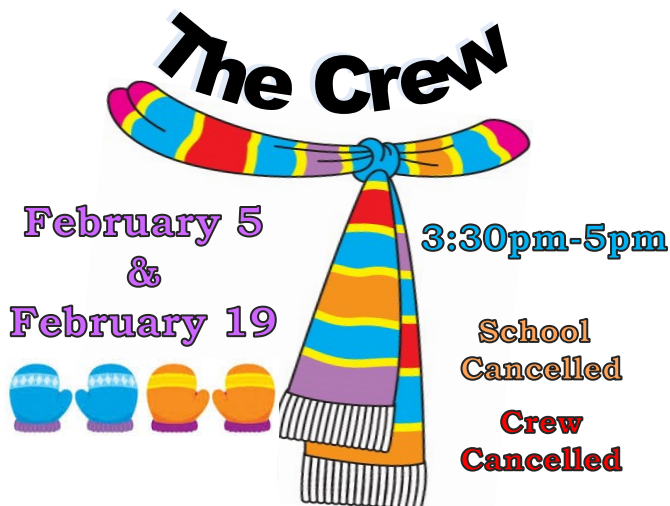

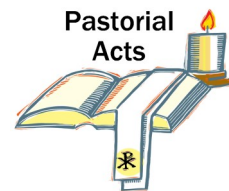

Our Lenten Focus

Lent, the church-year season that begins on Ash Wednesday, is a time of penitence and spiritual renewal. Some people give up a luxury or vice during Lent as a form of self-denial; others undertake a project that benefits others.

The point isn't to denigrate ourselves or to see how much we can do without. Instead, Lent helps us reflect on Jesus' death. As Timothy Keller writes in *The Reason for God*: "The Christian Gospel is that I am so flawed that Jesus had to die for me, yet I am so loved and valued that Jesus was glad to die for me. This leads to deep humility and deep confidence at the same time. It undermines both swaggering and sniveling. I cannot feel superior to anyone, and yet I have nothing to prove to anyone. I do not think more of myself nor less of myself. Instead, I think of myself less."

Do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility regard others as better than yourselves.

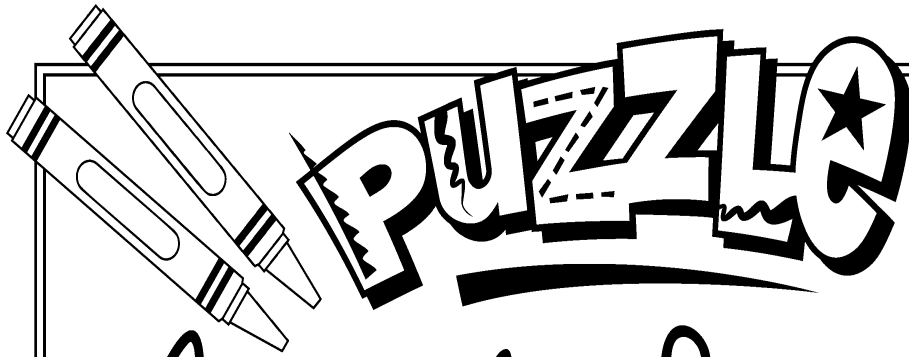

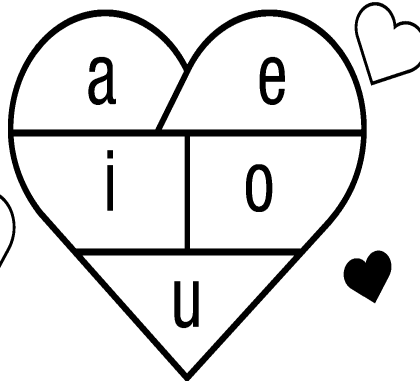


A friend in Jesus

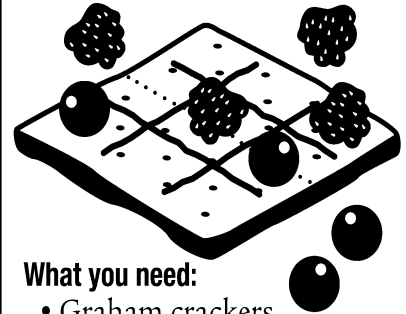
