# TRINITY MISSIONS

## LUTHERAN WORLD RELIEF

Lutherans have been feeding the hungry, clothing the naked, and befriending those in need through *Lutheran World Relief* for over 50 years. One of the ways the 'Women of Trinity' brings hope to those in need is by assembling quilts, baby care kits, personal care kits, and school kits. During the next coming months Trinity Women will be asking for donations to fill these kits. If you are unable to fill a full kit, it's okay to give what you can. Every little bit helps. A collection box is located near the church office.

## DUNN COUNTY RELIEF

Not only will we be collecting for *Lutheran World Relief*, we will also be collecting for *Dunn County Relief* where many people in the area are in need. Some of the agencies benefiting will be WestCAP, Stepping Stones, and 3-C (United Way).

## QUILT PROJECT

The Trinity Quilting Ladies make quilts to donate to Lutheran World Relief, Dunn County agencies, Luther Park auctions, raffles, Trinity baptisms and confirmations, and other places/people where needed.

### ***April was "Quilt Supply" Month***

Below is a list of items needed for quilts:

Fabric; cotton, flannel, etc.; any kind, any size, any color

Thread; any color

Flat Bed Sheets; used for backs, any size, any color but White

Batting

Heavy Crotchet Thread; any color

Monetary Donations

### ***May is "Baby Care Kit" Month***

*Baby Care Kits* are distributed as part of emergency and relief efforts, but they are also given out as part of LWR health initiatives to encourage women to seek prenatal care. *Baby Care Kits* are also needed in Dunn County. Below is a list of items needed for kits:

- 2 T-Shirts; lightweight cotton
- 2 Sleepers or Gowns, without feet, long or short sleeved, 6-24 month size
- 2 Receiving Blankets; medium weight cotton or flannel, or crocheted or knitted with light-weight yarn, up to 52"
- 4 Diapers; cloth, flat-fold preferred

- 1 Jacket, Sweater or Sweatshirt with a hood or include a baby cap prefer buttons or ties
- 2 Pairs of Socks
- 1 Hand Towel; dark colored
- 2 Bars of Soap; bath size, gentle
- 2 Diaper Pins

**Thrift Sales are a good source to check when looking for Mission Items such as fabric, baby clothes and receiving blankets, and towels.  
Make sure they are gently used and not stained.**

### ***July is "Personal Care Kit" Month***

Personal Care Kits will be distributed to Lutheran World Relief and Dunn County Relief. Below is a list of items needed for kits:

- 1 Bath Towel; light weight, dark colored, "20 x 40" to 52" x 27"
- 1 Bars of Soap; bath size
- 1 Toothbrush; adult size, in original package, can put in business envelope
- 1 Nail Clipper; metal
- 1 Comb; sturdy

Toiletries, deodorant, shampoo, conditioner, makeup, shaving supplies, nail file, nail polish, personal hygiene supplies, tooth paste, tooth picks, mouth wash, Kleenex, toilet paper, clothes soap, hair care supplies, etc.

### ***August is "School Kit" Month***

- 4 Notebooks; wide or college-ruled, 70 sheet
- 1 Pencil Sharpener
- 5 Pencils; #2, unsharpened with erasers
- 1 Eraser; 2½" long
- 1 Ruler; 30-centimeter or centimeter/inches ruler
- 1 Safety Scissors; blunt end, steel blades
- 1 Crayons; box of 16 or 24

Make this snack necklace to enjoy during summer travels.




## What you need:


