One of the things we have all struggled with during this time of quarantine; other than cancellations, school at home, work at home, and all the rest, is a loss of control. Every day we deal with so many unknowns; most especially, when can we do the things we love and do them safely without worrying about masks, social distancing, and the like? We keep wondering if the things we have scheduled will happen like vacations, trips, weddings, and the like. The loss of control, of not knowing, drives us **C R A Z Y**. I know it drives ME crazy as I like control. I like plans. I like to KNOW. My guess is that you are the same way.

Here, in this Psalm, we see the Psalmist is ready to give up their life to the Lord. They are willing to give up control to God who is faithful. Who redeems. Who saves. It is hard for us to fully give ourselves in faith to our Lord because we like control. Yet, when we give ourselves to the Lord we do so knowing that we are saved and redeemed and that God in Jesus Christ has taken care of all things. By giving ourselves to the Lord in faith, we are free from sin and death and have a freedom of spirit knowing that Christ has taken care of all things. Even more so, our burdens are now carried by our loving and faithful Lord. Our anxiety, our worry, our stress, our grief, our pain, are all carried by our Savior Jesus Christ, who takes them all to the cross with him and renews us day after day after day.

Jesus quotes this verse on the cross right before he dies and every day, through faith, we give ourselves to our Savior who redeems and loves us. It is hard right now with so many unknowns, but we have a faithful and loving God who is with us. Who takes our burdens, our sorrow, our pain and redeems us, loves us, strengthens us, and guides us. Don't be afraid to give yourself to the Lord who will take care of you. After all, God has got us and our Savior Jesus Christ is with us always till the end of the age.

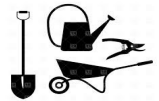

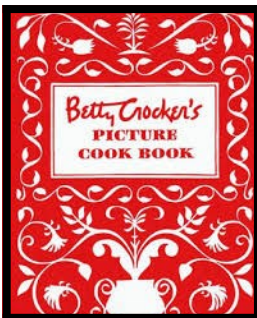
WOMEN OF TRINITY

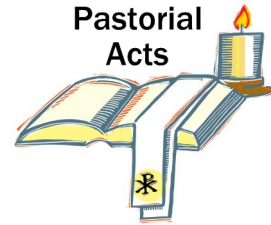

CONGREGATIONAL LETTER

Dear Trinity Members,

First off, we want to say thank you for your support of Trinity over these past two months. We thank you for joining us for worship online, drive-thru communion, viewing and sharing videos on Facebook and YouTube, and for your generous financial support. We are so grateful for your faith, support, and prayers and we are keeping each and every one of you in prayer as well.

Second, you may have questions regarding when we might worship inside the sanctuary again after the Wisconsin Supreme Court ended the Stay-At-Home order. At this time, Trinity activities will continue to remain cancelled and we will not be holding any in person worship services inside the building. We are following guidelines set out by the Dunn County Department of Health and following strategies put forth by the ELCA, the Wisconsin Council of Churches, and the CDC. All of these strategies first and foremost are about keeping everyone as safe as possible, especially the most vulnerable amongst us. We will continue to worship online on Sunday mornings at 9 am and Wednesday night at 7 pm and we will have parking lot worship services on June 7 & June 21st. We will continue to monitor everything closely and are taking steps so that when we can come together in the church building, we do so safely and appropriately.

Until that time comes, continue to keep each other in prayer and hold each other in love, as you are held in love and prayer by all of us. We are church together, no matter the circumstances, and Jesus Christ is walking with us giving us the hope and strength we need. May God bless all of you and stay safe and well.
