## WORSHIP UPDATE

People ask me, “How long we will continue our current schedule of worship?”

Right now, our schedule is an 8am in-person worship, with masks, and the 9am Parking Lot service (which is also live streamed) and our Wednesday night 6pm service which is online only.

First, the Wednesday worship will become in-person (with masks) starting on February 3<sup>rd</sup> at 6pm and will still be online. As for Sunday, we will continue with our current schedule until we can gather safely and reduce the need for people to be socially distant and/or be able to worship without masks. We will continue to look at guidance from the CDC, our Synod, and the Dunn County Health Department as we evaluate worship. If the weather on a Sunday makes the Parking Lot service impossible (ie, lots of snow), we will live stream from inside. We will continue to update you through email, the Facebook page, and our website. Thank you for your continued support of Trinity and its ministries. PB

# A COLORFUL body

## What you need:

- Crayons
- Metal baking sheet
- Adult help
- Metal gingerbread man cookie cutter

## What you do:

1. Remove labels and break crayons into 1-inch pieces.
2. Scatter pieces on the baking sheet, about two layers thick.
3. Bake for 10 minutes at 350 degrees until melted. Allow to cool 15 minutes.
4. When melted crayons are the consistency of playdough, press the cookie cutter through them (while still on pan).
5. Cool the pan in freezer for 15 minutes until crayons are hardened.
6. Remove from pan and break apart the shapes.
