October 9, 2021 2021 Youth Mission Trip "In the morning, while it was still very dark, Jesus got up and went out to a deserted place, and there he prayed. And Simon and his companions hunted for him. When they found him, they said to him, "Everyone is searching for you." He answered, "Let us go on to the neighboring towns, so that I may proclaim the message there also; for that is what I came out to do." And he went throughout Galilee, proclaiming the message in their synagogues and casting out demons."

Mark 1:35-39

Though I never reached the lofty heights of being a Boy Scout, I was raised by my parents to always "be prepared." It is one of the reasons I'm also super early to everything: you never know when a semi-truck will block your route to your destination, causing you to go 20 minutes out of your way to get you where you are going. Or why I get to church on Sunday at 5am. Do I need to be there that early? No. I've done worship getting there from a plane ride only 20 minutes before. But I feel better when I'm here early, making sure everything is ready and prepared. It is why I often pack for my trips a week in advance: you can never be prepared enough.

I thought of preparedness in this reading from the Gospel of Mark. This short reading seems pretty simple but it can tell us a lot about how to be prepared in life. Just prior to these verses, Jesus had done a bunch of healing at Peter's house. The next morning, Jesus gets up to go pray and the disciples not only look for him, but hunt for him. They WANT to find him, badly. They tell him everyone is looking for him and once Jesus is found, he proclaims that they will go traveling and doing ministry throughout Galilee, preaching and healing.

But before they go, what has Jesus done? Jesus has prayed. Jesus has spent time with his heavenly Father in prayer, getting ready for what is going to come next. Jesus takes a moment to prepare himself for the work before him. This is a lesson for us in this Lenten season to take a moment every day and prepare for what is to come in our daily lives. Sure, we need to get the kids together, get our things ready to go for work, make sure everything is set. But we should also take a moment or two to pray, to ask the Lord to guide us and be with us in the day ahead. To try to take a moment to acknowledge the important role that the Lord will take in that day, guiding us, strengthening us, and walking with us no matter what the day may bring.

We have all said a prayer or two before something has happened, to prepare ourselves. But we often do that only in the big moments or when the moment could be scary. What if we did it every day? What if we prepared for our day every day by taking a moment to talk with our loving God? I do this but it doesn't come naturally to me. I have to be intentional about it and by taking that moment it has helped to calm me down and put into focus what the day will bring.

Let this time of Lent be a chance for you to intentionally prepare yourself for whatever the day may bring with some time in prayer. Let your conversation with your Savior be something that calms a troubled spirit, give guidance for your life, and remind you that you do not face the day alone. Your Savior is with you. Always. For that we can say, "Thanks be to God!"



A Lenten History Lesson

Though the date of Easter varies, the majority of the Lenten season occurs during March. In fact, the word Lent comes from the Anglo-Saxon words lenctentid (meaning "March") and lencten (meaning "spring"). The first reference to Lent dates back to 325 AD, in one of the 20 canons decreed at the council of Nicaea. By the eighth century, Christians started observing Lent, and a 10th-century monk named Aelfric connected the use of ashes and "the Lenten fast" to the pre-Easter period. Lent lasts 40 days to represent Jesus' time in the wilderness, when he was tempted by the devil. The six Sundays that occur between Ash Wednesday and Easter Sunday aren't counted as part of Lent; instead, as the traditional day of worship, they're considered "mini-Easters."




What you need:
