*Jesus said to the leader of the synagogue,  
"Do not fear, only believe."  
Mark 5:36b*

One of the most powerful emotions we feel as human beings is fear. Fear provokes reactions in us. Sometimes that reaction is inaction, being so afraid that we don't do anything, even if we know we should. Fear pushes us to make terrible choices, to compromise our integrity and our beliefs. Fear can make us hate, especially when we are afraid of new things or things we haven't experienced or understand. We often fear people and places that are different from us and that fear causes us to perpetuate racism and intolerance. Fear makes us doubt our worth, abilities, and even reason for being.

Fear is something I struggle with, especially the last example. The fear that I feel often makes me feel unworthy. Unworthy of love. Unworthy of acceptance. I fear that what I have bring into the world is insignificant, unimportant, and even worse, damaging to others and unhelpful. That fear has caused me to strive harder and work harder than maybe I otherwise would. But it has also caused me great anxiety, sleepless nights, and emotional pain.

The above verse occurs as Jesus is going to the house of Jairus, a leader in the synagogue whose daughter is ill. They stop Jesus on the way to tell him, and Jairus, that the girl is dead. This is Jesus' response. "Do not fear, only believe." Jesus often tells his disciples to not fear. I hear that message every day. I need that message every day. To not fear, only believe. Believe in my Savior who defeats fear. Believe in my Savior who walks with me and will guide me. Believe in my Savior who gives me strength despite my fear.

Jesus will raise Jairus's daughter and Jesus raises us as well. Raises us from the power of fear, raises us out of despair, and raises us to eternal life. Fear is a powerful emotion but the love and grace of God in Jesus Christ is greater than fear. It sustains us and strengthens us. It does that for me. Do not fear, only believe. Believe in Jesus.

Believe in the power of Jesus' love and grace for you. For it is for you today and every day. For that we can say, "Thanks be to God!" Amen.



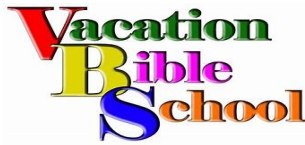

Dear Trinity Members,

I want to begin by thanking you for your incredible support of Trinity and its ministry over the past 14 months. Your faithfulness, generosity, and prayers have meant the world to me and to everyone at Trinity.

We are coming to the end of this pandemic, with people getting vaccinated and many things cautiously coming back to normal. In light of recent CDC decisions, the Trinity Church Council on Sunday, May 16<sup>th</sup>, have made the following decisions:

- Beginning immediately: If everyone in a small group activity is vaccinated, masks are optional.
- Sunday, June 6: 8am worship will become mask optional.  
Fellowship will also return after the 9am worship service.

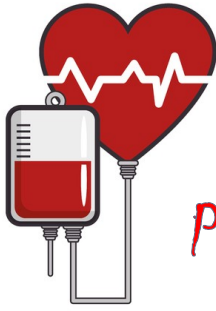

The Fourth of July, also known as Independence Day or July 4<sup>th</sup>, has been a federal holiday in the United States since 1941, but the tradition of Independence Day celebrations goes back to the 18<sup>th</sup> century and the American Revolution.

On July 2, 1776, the Continental Congress voted in favor of independence, and two days later delegates from the 13 colonies adopted the Declaration of Independence, a historic document drafted by Thomas Jefferson.

From 1776 to the present day, July 4<sup>th</sup> has been celebrated as the birth of American independence, with festivities ranging from fireworks, parades and concerts to more casual family gatherings and barbecues.

The Fourth of July 2021 is on Sunday, July 4, 2021; the federal holiday will be observed on Monday, July 5, 2021.

### **Did you know?**

John Adams believed that July 2<sup>nd</sup> was the correct date on which to celebrate the birth of American independence, and would reportedly turn down invitations to appear at July 4<sup>th</sup> events in protest.

Adams and Thomas Jefferson both died on July 4, 1826, the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the adoption of the Declaration of Independence.

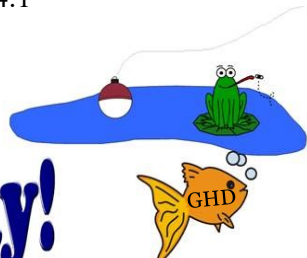

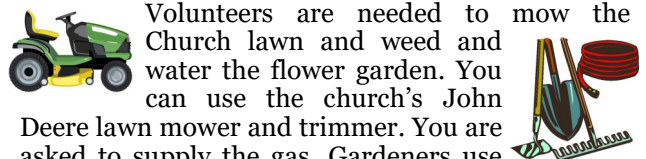

- 4 Diapers; cloth, flat-fold preferred

- 1 Jacket, Sweater or Sweatshirt with a hood or include a baby cap prefer buttons or ties
- 2 Pairs of Socks
- 1 Hand Towel; dark colored
- 2 Bars of Soap; bath size, gentle
- 2 Diaper Pins

**Thrift Sales are a good source to check when looking for Mission Items such as fabric, baby clothes and receiving blankets, and towels.  
Make sure they are gently used and not stained.**

### ***July is "Personal Care Kit" Month***

Personal Care Kits will be distributed to Lutheran World Relief and Dunn County Relief. Below is a list of items needed for kits:

- 1 Bath Towel; light weight, dark colored, "20 x 40" to 52" x 27"
- 1 Bars of Soap; bath size
- 1 Toothbrush; adult size, in original package, can put in business envelope
- 1 Nail Clipper; metal
- 1 Comb; sturdy

Toiletries, deodorant, shampoo, conditioner, makeup, shaving supplies, nail file, nail polish, personal hygiene supplies, tooth paste, tooth picks, mouth wash, Kleenex, toilet paper, clothes soap, hair care supplies, etc.

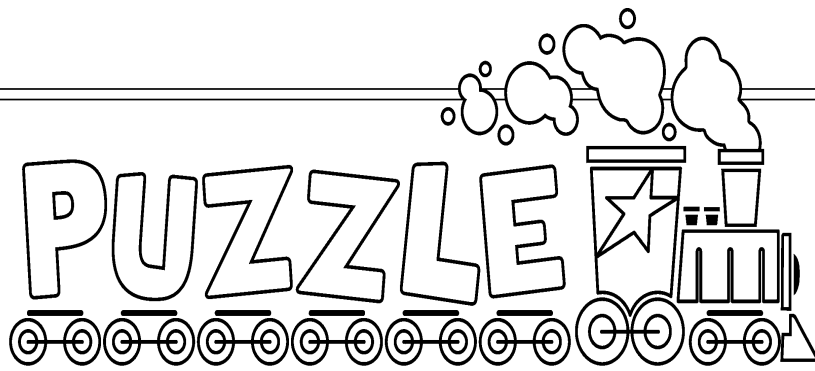

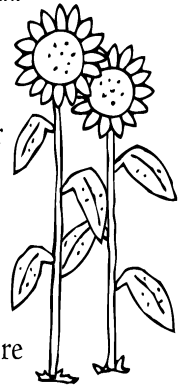

Make a sunflower, which turns its head to follow the sun.

### What you need:

- Paper plate
- Yellow marker
- Scissors
- Yarn (black and brown)



### What you do:

1. Color the entire plate yellow.
2. Around the edge, cut out an odd number of triangles. Evenly space the cuts to form flower petals.
3. Poke a hole in the plate's center. String black yarn through the hole and over one triangle cut. Tie a knot at the back of the plate.
4. Continue looping yarn through the hole and over the remaining cuts. Secure the end. The flower should look like a wagon wheel with black spokes.
5. Tie the brown yarn to a black "spoke." Weave the brown yarn over and under the spokes in a circle. Continue until the sunflower has a large center. Then tie the end.
6. Display your craft as a reminder to follow the Son, Jesus!
