The other day I looked down and realized something. I was pretty sunburnt. Burnt to a crisp. At first I was confused, wondering why it happened, forgetting that it is summer after all and many people tend to get sunburnt in the summer. But I wanted to know why. Then I remembered: I was rushing and I forgot to put some sunscreen on. Oops. My mistake led to some nice bright red flesh.

Now, as I looked down at my searing flesh, applying some lotion to ease the discomfort, I had too choices. I could dwell and stew about the stupidity of my mistake, about how dumb I was. I hardly ever forget to put sunscreen on, whether it is on the golf course, getting ready to mow the lawn, walking at the Minnesota Landscape Arboretum, or on vacation in Florida. It is why I rarely get burnt. But here I was, feeling like a crispy piece of bacon. So I could just keep beating myself up for my dumb mistake. Or, I could move on, take the lesson to double check about putting sunscreen on, and keep living.

See, I think we spend a lot of time in our own guilt. We make a mistake in life and when dwell on it. We stew about it. We beat ourselves up over it. Gosh knows I do that. I do it too much. And we carry the guilt of our mistakes, our sins, with us everywhere we go. This guilt has consequences. It makes us feel that we are not good enough, that we are always coming up short. Even worse, it makes us feel that we are unworthy of being loved. By our family. Friends. Co-workers. And even God. Our guilt over our mistakes makes us feel like we are unworthy of the blessings we receive in life.

But the truth is that we are going to make mistakes. We all sin and fall short of the glory of God. We all mess up and fall short of our own expectations and hopes for ourselves. We screw up. But we can't let those mistakes define us. After all, God doesn't let our mistakes define us. For as it says in Hebrews 8:12, "For I will be merciful toward their iniquities, and I will remember their sins no more."

God is serious about forgiveness. After all, God sent his only Son Jesus Christ to die for your sins, to free you from the slavery of sin and guilt that so often consume us. God did this so that you can live fully and joyfully. Yes, we sin. Against God, against each other, against ourselves. And we acknowledge those shortcomings. But in doing that, we also receive forgiveness from our gracious and loving God. For nothing separates us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord. Not even your sin.

Give yourself a break, my friends. You are not perfect. Stop trying to be. Stop taking so much time to dwell on sinfulness and mistakes. Instead, learn from them and place your trust in your gracious Savior. Remember that you are loved, you are forgiven, and you are free. For that we can say, "Thanks be to God!"

What Does it Mean to Have a Pastoral Intern?

On August 8th, we will be installing Katie Wagner as our first Pastoral Intern. Though we are familiar with Katie as her time as our Youth Coordinator, being a Pastoral Intern is a completely different position with different responsibilities and authority. Below are some questions you might be wondering about as Katie moves into this new role.

What is a Pastoral Intern? A Pastoral Intern is like a 'student pastor'. Think of a student teacher but for pastors. Katie will be experiencing and doing everything a pastor does, except for presiding at Holy Communion. Though Katie has done some things pastors do in her time here since we were her learning congregation, this will be more in-depth. She will assist at funerals and weddings; go on visits to homes, hospitals, and nursing homes; preach more often; lead Bible Study, Confirmation, and other activities; and she'll attend church council and committee meetings. Basically, everything that PB does, she will do.

Are there other things Katie will do as a Pastoral Intern? Katie will also be doing an internship project that will be implemented in the congregation. That project will be determined after Katie starts.

What happens to the Youth Coordinator position? That position has ceased to exist. Its duties will be fulfilled by PB and Katie.

How long will Katie be our Pastoral Intern? She will be our intern until August of 2022.

How can we help in Katie's development as a Pastoral Intern? First, you can pray for her as she learns and grows and ask for God to guide her. Second, you may be asked by the Intern Committee to help evaluate Katie. Your willingness to help and to be honest in your evaluation if you are asked will be extremely important. Third, you should give Katie the same level of respect you give Pastor Brad and encourage her as you do PB. Finally, have patience with Katie as she will be trying and doing new things and doing things that will challenge her. This year is about learning and growing.

What does the Intern Committee do and who is on it? The Intern Committee meets with Katie every month for conversation, evaluation, and support. They have to fill out required evaluations that are sent to the Seminary and the Synod. The committee members are: Ginny Waller (Chair), Bob Bird, Heather Clark, Deb Holmlund, and Ron Peshaw. Pastor Brad is not on the committee.

We hope that you will keep Katie in prayer as she starts this new adventure. At the same time, pray for Pastor Brad as he supervises and guides her and pray for the congregation as we help her in her education and in the blessings we will receive from her ministry.




