"A gift opens doors . . . " Proverbs 19:6a

I found this verse from Proverbs as I searched for inspiration for this month's *Good News* and it really intrigued me. I started to think of reasons why we might give someone a gift. To celebrate a special occasion like a birthday, anniversary, graduation, and the like. We might give a gift out of thankfulness for what someone has done for us. There has been many a husband who has given a gift asking for forgiveness for something they did wrong, so we give gifts to show people we care and our sorry. And, of course, we give gifts on special occasions, like Christmas.

But no matter why we give gifts, a gift can open a door. For when we give a gift we show our appreciation for the relationship we are in with another person. Giving a gift shows that they matter, that they are important, that they have a special place in our lives. This symbol of caring, of relationship, opens up doors to establish a deeper and more meaningful relationship or a chance to begin a new relationship or strengthen an old one.

The gift of Jesus Christ, born in a manager in Bethlehem, opens a door of relationship with us and our God. For this gift of the babe born in Bethlehem shows us that God cares about us, that God wants to save us through this Savior born in Bethlehem. After all, this Jesus is Emmanuel, "God with us," to show us that God is with us always and that we are loved, cared for, and saved.

The gift of Jesus to us establishes a relationship of grace and mercy between us and God. It opens a door so that we can connect with God, to see God not as a God of wrath or judgement but as a God of grace, love, mercy, and steadfast love. After all, as it says in Romans 6:23, "For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord."

This Christmas season, I hope that the gifts you give others open doors so that you can show others that they are loved, important, and matter. And remember that the gift of Jesus Christ given to you opens a door so that you can see the grace and mercy of God and know that you are loved, important, matter, and our saved. 



Create personalized initial ornaments for family and friends.




### What you need:
