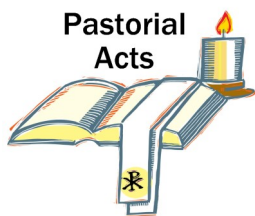

### What you do:

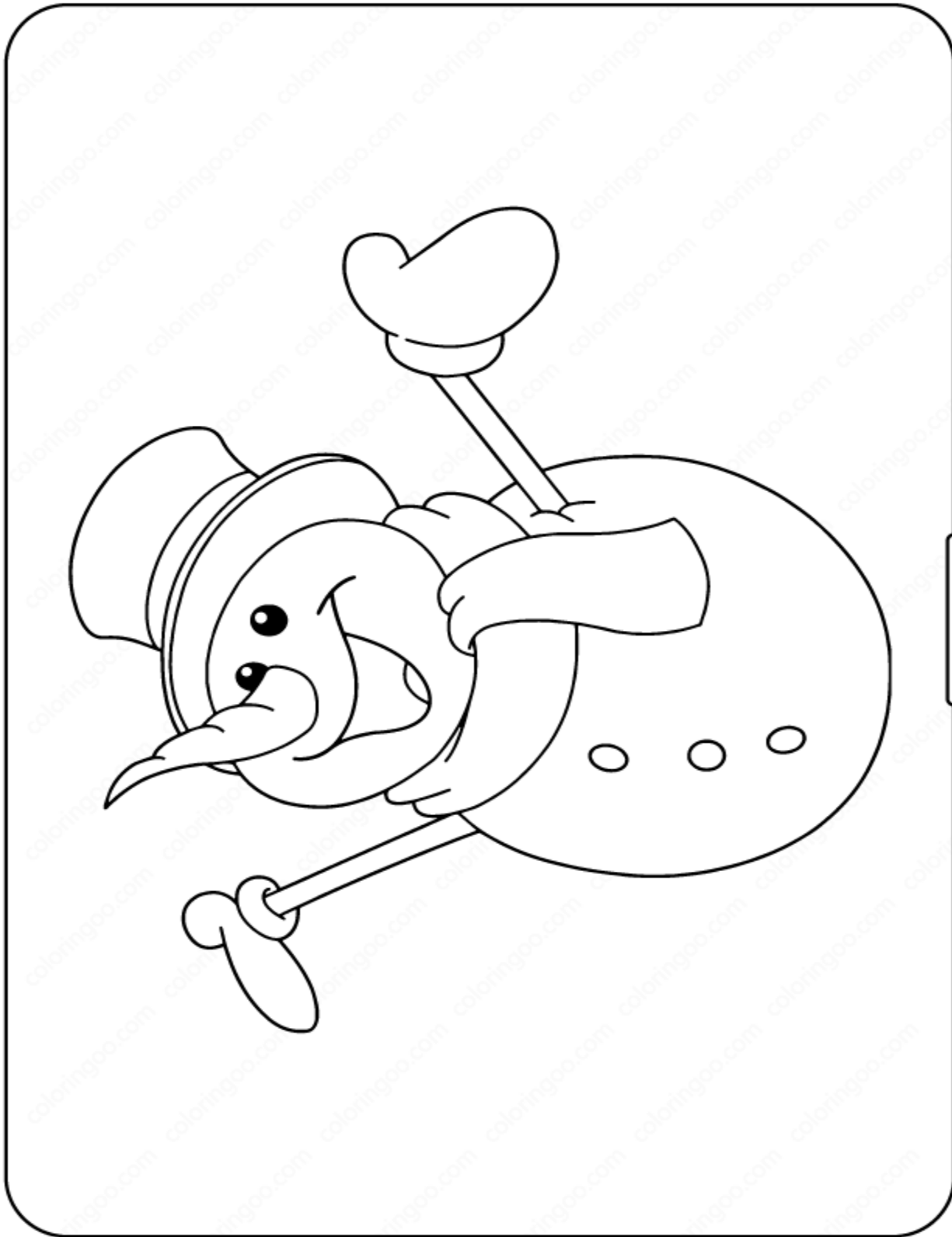
1. In order, layer the first five ingredients into the jar.
