Blessings to you all in this New Year!





In order, layer the first five ingredients into the jar. 2. Trace the outline of the lid onto cardstock. Cut out. 3. On the card, write these directions: Remove wrapper from bouillon cube. Add contents of jar to saucepan. Add 4 cups water and a can of diced tomatoes. Bring to a boil over high heat, reduce to low. Simmer about 20 minutes, until barley is tender. Serve with parmesan cheese. 4. Place the card atop the lid. Screw on the canning ring

to keep it in place.
