

But that is not how we live as followers of Jesus Christ. We can look to tomorrow with hope because Jesus is with us. We know that in Christ we have eternal life, that the Lord carries our burdens, and is there for us always. Life can be hard, cruel, and painful, especially when we grieve and suffer. But life is never without hope because we are never without Jesus. Ever. It is a great big beautiful tomorrow and it is shining because the light of the world shines upon us. Jesus Christ shines upon you. And it gives you hope, for it is a "great, big, beautiful tomorrow." Thanks be to God!

- 1 package unflavored gelatin
- ¾ cup very warm water
- 1 tsp salt
- ¾ cup gel body wash
- Food coloring
- Rubbing alcohol in spray bottle
- Silicone baking molds

What you do:

- 1. In a bowl, stir gelatin and warm water until dissolved.
- Add salt, body wash and a few drops of food coloring. Stir.
- 3. Spray molds with rubbing alcohol (to prevent bubbles). Place molds on a tray.
- 4. Pour mixture into the molds. Refrigerate until set, about two hours.
- 5. Pop soap out of molds and store in an airtight container.
