This presents that story of the passion of Jesus like a true crime podcast. I encourage you to download and listen every week through Apple podcasts or Spotify. This is a great way to hear the story of Jesus' passion in a new way and a great way to share it with others.

Lent is a journey in which we remember what is truly important to us as disciples of Jesus Christ: that Jesus gave his life so that we can have eternal life. It is a chance to renew our faith, connect with each other, help our neighbor, and take the journey with our Savior as he goes to the cross to defeat sin and death for us. May the Lord be with you in whatever journey you take during this month, and may the Holy Spirit strengthen you in faith and hope as you walk the journey of Lent.

Greetings from your Pastoral Intern!

I wanted to take the time this month to share with you more about my internship project and what it will entail during Lent.

As part of my internship year, I am required to do an internship project and I have chosen to combine two things I love: Jesus and true crime! If you think about it, the story of Jesus Christ is the ultimate true crime story. It involves one of the most horrific acts that humanity has enacted on one of its own, but involves a redemption story that is one for the ages.

The primary part of this project is the creation of a podcast. What is a podcast, you might ask? A podcast is an audio program that can be listened to on a variety of devices. Think radio! I will be telling this ultimate true crime story in podcast form throughout all of Lent, and it is called The Word Examined Podcast. I will also be preaching during Lenten services, offering us a chance to consider the perspectives of bystanders in these well-known moments in Jesus' life and placing ourselves into the story as well. Finally, I will be leading Bible Study during Lent and including corresponding topics for discussion.

I hope you'll join me in this journey! I ask you to be willing to place yourself into a story that we know well, but one that can continue to open our eyes to the ways that God works through Jesus Christ to free us from sin and death and give us eternal life. This is a celebration of the promises of God given for each and every one of us.

How do I find the podcast?

The Word Examined Podcast is available on the two major podcast platforms: Apple Podcasts and Spotify. Both are available as apps on iPhones/Apple Products and Android devices.

Directions for Apple Podcasts: The app is standard on most iPhones but also can be downloaded from the App Store. Download the app if needed. Open the app and click search in the bottom right. Type "The Word Examined Podcast". Click on the first option and click the (+) sign in the top right corner to subscribe (notified of new episodes). All episodes will be found in this same location as they are released.

Directions for Spotify: Download the Spotify app. Open the app and create an account if you don't already have one. Click search, the second option from the left on the bottom. Type "The Word Examined Podcast." Click on the first option and click (Follow) toward the top to subscribe (notified of new episodes). All episodes will be found in this same location as they are released.

The Podcast Audio will also be uploaded to "The Word Examined Podcast" YouTube channel. Simply search for this channel and you can follow along here as well!

If you have questions or need help finding the podcast, please let me know and I'll be happy to help!

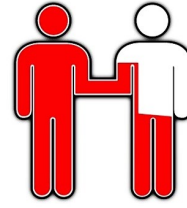

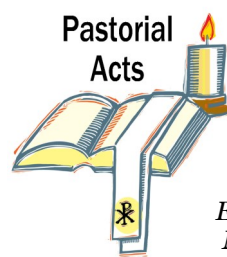

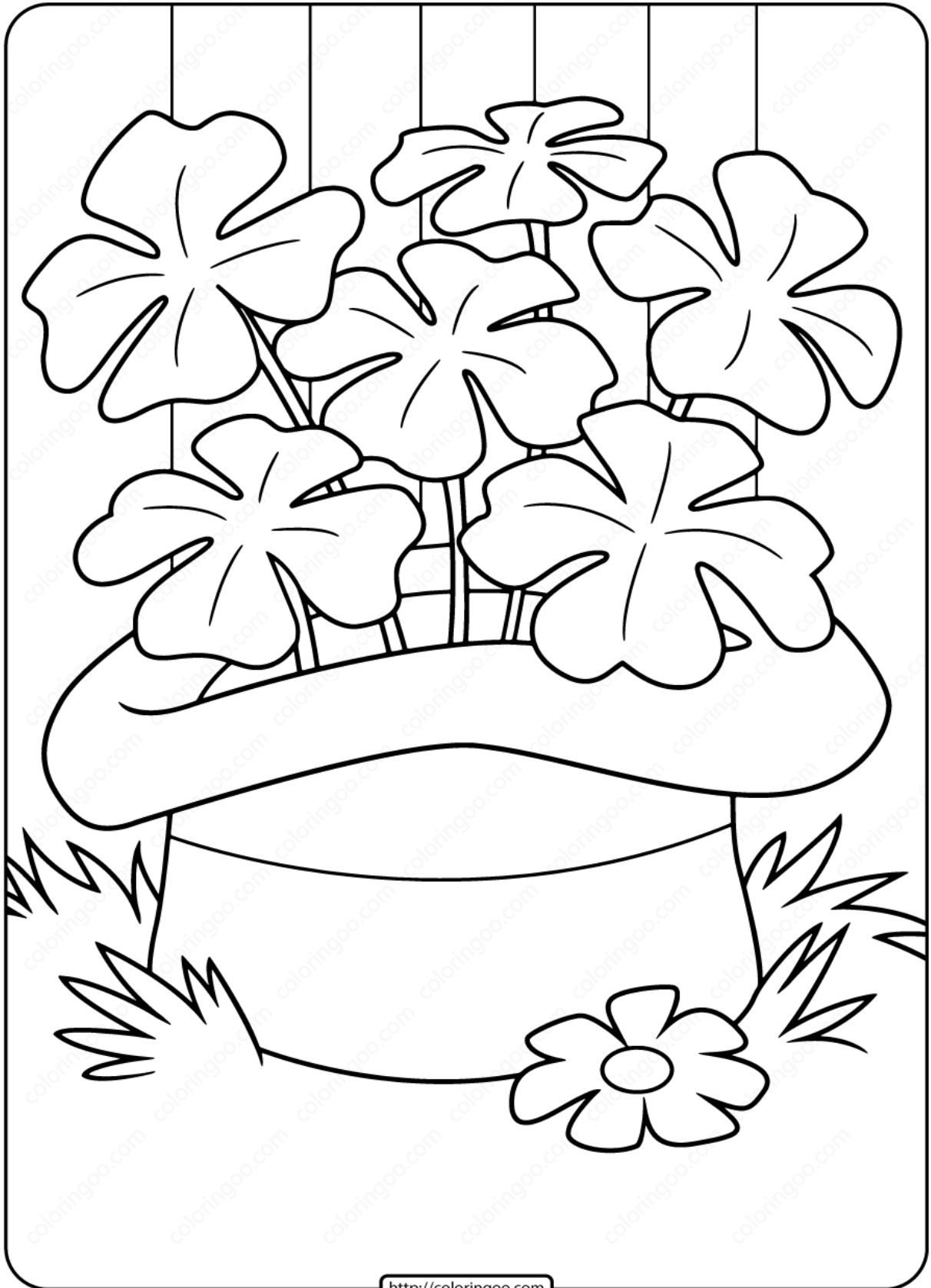
