I wonder what causes you more anxiety: to not be able to find your keys or your cell phone. On one hand, when I can't find my keys, I get a little anxious but I also know I have a back-up set of keys that I can use if I need them. If I can't find my phone, then it is like my life is over. How will I email? Stay up to date on Twitter? Play Disney Emoji Blitz? I mean, it is like my life would crumble into a thousand pieces if I don't find that phone. I have even less anxiety not being able to find my wallet then not being able to find my cell phone. Are you the same way?

I wonder if that is how the Lord feels about us when we become lost. When we drift away from the path the Lord wants us to be on. When we ignore God's Word and presence in our lives. I would like to think so. I think God gets pretty anxious and wants to bring us back. After all, as it says in Luke 19:10, "For the Son of Man came to seek out and to save the lost." Jesus says this statement to the people who are upset that he is a guest of Zacchaeus, a hated tax collector (you remember the Sunday School about the wee little man? That is him). The mission of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ is to save the lost. To save you.

And let's not mince words: we are the lost. We so often look at the rest of the world and pass judgement on them like those who grumble about Zacchaeus. But we are the lost. For we all sin and fall short of the glory of God. We so often make wrong choices, act selfishly, hurt our neighbor, and put the material things of this world before our God and before helping the other. We are the lost.

But the Lord seeks us out to save us. The Lord does not give up on us. Jesus does not give up on you. That is why Christ goes to the cross. To bring you back. To save you. Jesus upends everything so that you would be found. So that you might come back to the fold and follow the path of faith. Jesus will keep searching for you. Always.

If we go crazy over something we have lost, just think about how much God is trying to find you. God gives everything for you to be found, gives his only Son, in order to save you and bring you hope. Yes, we are often the lost. We go astray. But by the grace of God in Jesus Christ, we are also the found. For we are saved by grace through faith in Jesus Christ, who never gives up on us. For that we can say, "Thanks be to God!"

If you receive items you don't want, please offer them to others you know who may need them.






