Christmas would seem really strange without Christmas music. Can you imagine coming into worship on Christmas Eve and not singing “Silent Night?” Or hearing the little kids sing “Away in the Manger” during the Christmas program? Think about all those beloved Christmas songs. “Hark! The Herald Angels Sing.” “Joy to the World.” “Go, Tell it on the Mountain.” “O Come, All Ye Faithful.” “White Christmas.” “Frosty the Snowman.” “Rudolph the Red-Nosed Reindeer.” These are just a few. If they were gone, Christmas wouldn’t be Christmas. It would be, something less. I mean, the lefse makers riot if I don’t have Christmas music going when we are making lefse. It just keeps us going and brings us joy.

Of course, music was at the very first Christmas and even before. Mary sings after she finds out she is carrying Jesus. The angels sing at Jesus’ birth. And we sing for the same reason they do: joy. We sing for joy. Not because we are receiving presents wrapped in pretty paper. Not because of the all the great Christmas treats like lefse, cookies, a Christmas ham, or candy canes. Not because of the twinkling lights on a house or even the families gathered around a Christmas ham inside that house. We sing because our salvation has come. We sing because, in that babe born in Bethlehem, death is defeated, sin has now power, and hope is at hand. We sing because we are saved. Our salvation has come.

That is why we are joyful and that is why we sing. All the other parts of Christmas, including the music, don’t happen without Jesus being born. All those traditions that we love and that make Christmas special don’t matter as much as the fact that our salvation has come. Hope is here. Light shines in the darkness and the darkness does not overcome it. And a song of joy comes from our hearts because Jesus is born.

May you sing for joy this Christmas and remember why we sing. Why the angels sing. Why the whole earth sings. Jesus is born. Merry Christmas.

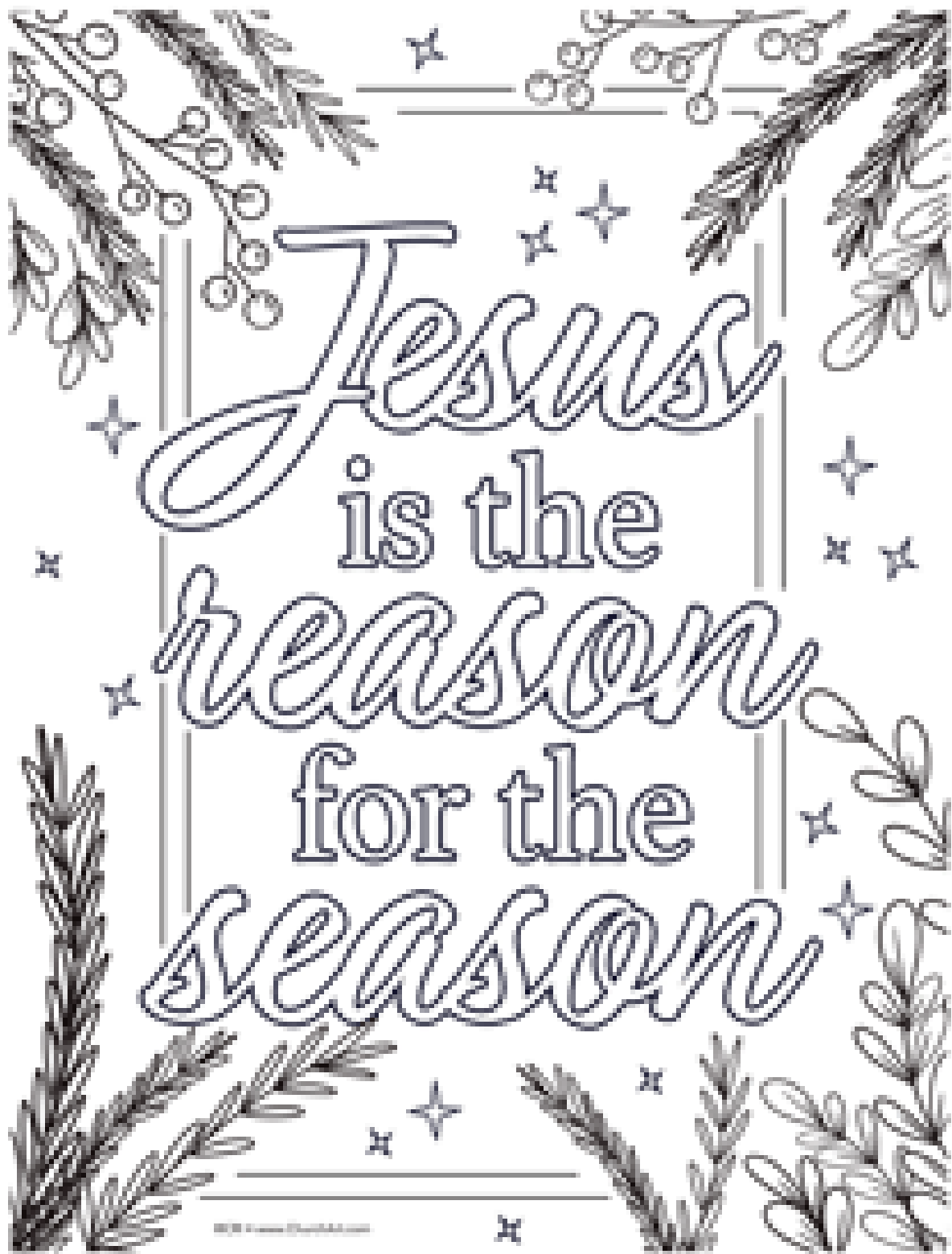

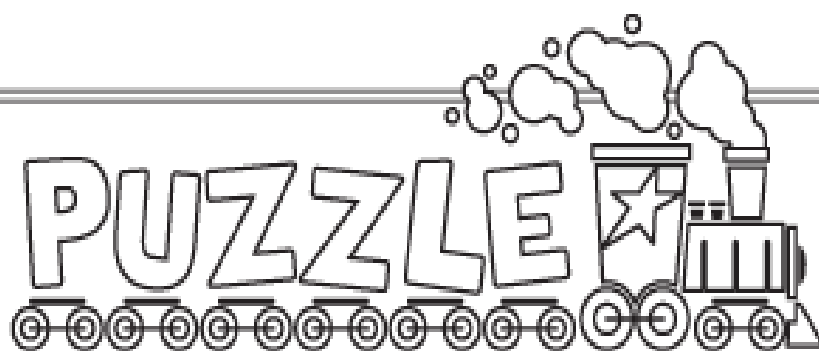
