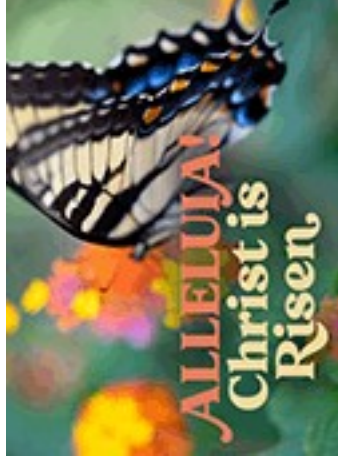

Our puppy Baxter loves a lot of things. He loves his lamby toy that he takes with him everywhere. He loves to chew on Kapono’s ear. He loves treats and to look out the window. And he loves to snuggle in between your legs on the chair. When I come home for lunch, after I let him out, he goes immediately to the chair (usually with lamby in his mouth) and jumps up and down, waiting for me to sit down. Then he jumps up as I put up the foot rest and after a quick climb up my chest and head to look outside, he climbs down and snuggles between my legs. And if I stay there for the next three hours, so will he. And even if I get up, forcing him up, he sometimes waits right by the chair, waiting for me to come back. He wants to be with me.

Your God wants to be with you. Wants to snuggle up with you in a cuddle of love and grace. Your God wants to be with you so bad, God sent Jesus Christ, God’s only Son, to the cross to defeat sin and death for you and rose from the dead for you. God wanted to remove any barriers between you and God. And so God removed the power of sin. The power of death. The power of the devil. All gone so that we could be with God and God could be with us. That is how much you are loved. Take the love Baxter has for me and increase it by infinity. That’s how much God loves you.

Here in the early part of April, we will journey with Jesus to the cross, to the tomb, and to his resurrection. All of this is done to show you how much you are loved and how much God wants to be with you. I hope you join us for our Holy Week and Easter services so you can hear this story and be reminded how much you are loved. And I pray that your faith might be strengthened, your hope renewed, and your joy profound as you remember the love of God for you in Jesus Christ. And I pray that when you snuggle with your pet, when you feel that love, you might remember the love of God in Jesus Christ you receive every day. For that we can say, “Thanks be to God!”

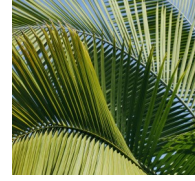

Due to the ongoing risks of COVID-19, all food distribution is curbside pick-up only. Pre-packed bags/boxes of non-perishables and fresh food are sized for families of 4. If there are more in your household, you will receive additional boxes.

Please **MAKE SURE** there is room in the trunk or hatchback of your vehicle before you pull up to the intake point. We also ask that you wear a mask once you pull up to have the food loaded into your car.

If there is not room in your trunk or hatch, you'll be asked to drive to another area of the parking lot where you will be able to load the food yourself.

If you receive items you don't want, please offer them to others you know who may need them.

Nonperishables may be returned to the designated donation area of our building, Monday through Friday, from 9am to 4pm.

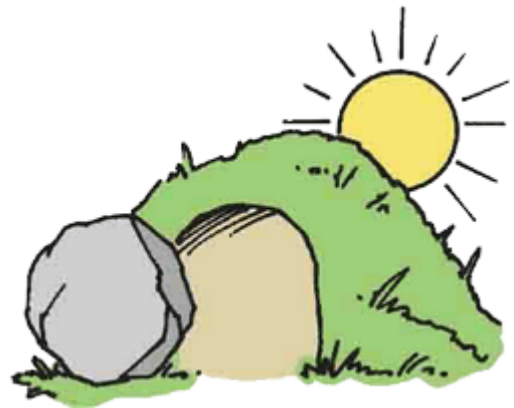

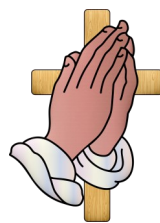

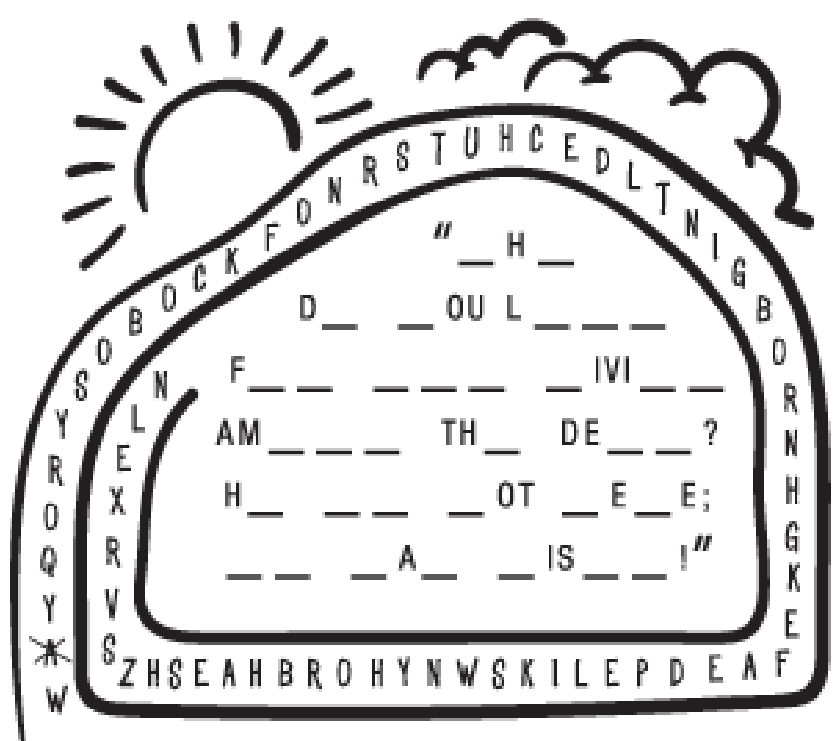


PUZZLE

Directions: Cross out every other letter in the maze. Write the remaining letters in order to complete Luke 24:5-6, NIV.

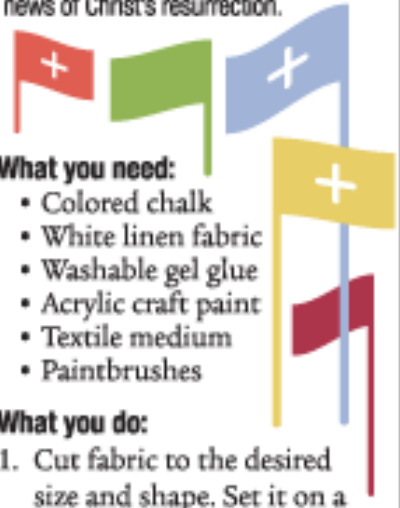


LUKE 24:5-6, NIV

Good news flags

Use batik, a unique fabric-dyeing method, to create flags celebrating the good news of Christ's resurrection.



What you need:

- Colored chalk
- White linen fabric
- Washable gel glue
- Acrylic craft paint
- Textile medium
- Paintbrushes

What you do:

1. Cut fabric to the desired size and shape. Set it on a flat, protected surface. With chalk, lightly sketch an Easter design or message.
2. Completely cover the chalk lines with gel glue. Let dry.
3. Mix equal parts paint and textile medium. Paint the flag with that mixture, which makes paint permanent. Let dry.
4. Soak the dried fabric in warm water a few minutes. Then gently peel away the glue to reveal the unpainted areas. Lay flat to dry.
5. Hang the flags and celebrate!
