“When the Pharisees saw this, they said to his disciples, ‘Why does your teacher eat with tax collectors and sinners?’ ¹²But when he heard this, he said, ‘Those who are well have no need of a physician, but those who are sick. ¹³Go and learn what this means, ‘I desire mercy, not sacrifice.’ For I have come to call not the righteous but sinners.” Matthew 9:11-13

There is such contempt in the voice of the Pharisees in the above reading. “How dare Jesus, who purports to be from God, some sort of prophet, consort with these awful sinners?” they must be thinking. It reminds me of when watching a show set in Victorian England the awful judgement that is passed on people for those they are friends with. Or, if you would dare sit with someone at lunch in high school that was part of a different group than you. We so often pass judgement on others, put people into categories. Good and bad. Cool and uncool. Acceptable and unacceptable.

You know who doesn't do that? Jesus. Jesus came not to save the perfect people but the imperfect one. To sit with the sinners. To welcome the outcasts. To befriend the misfit. Jesus came to save sinners and the truth that Jesus knows that we so often forget is that we are all sinners. We all need the grace and mercy of God in Jesus Christ. Each and everyone of us. That means all are invited to partake in the love, grace, and forgiveness offered to us by the Son of God Jesus Christ. Whether we like it or not.

One of the great fallacies in the world is that the church is a place for holy people. Sadly, the greatest proclaimer of this lie has often been the church itself. “We are the place for the good people, the righteous, the holy,” the church has said to the world. Even worse, it has declared, “We are better than you.” It sounds just like the Pharisees. Pompous. Condescending. Judgmental.

The church is a place for sinners, for the church is a place for Jesus. And Jesus goes where the sinners go. To save them. To save us. We are all sinners who have been made saints through the work of Jesus Christ. We are the forgotten, the lost, the misfits, the outsider, the uncool. We are sinners who are in need of redeeming, in need of hope, in need of new life. And we find it in Jesus Christ, who sits with us. Who welcomes us. Who cares for us. And who will die and rise for us.

All are welcome to come hear and experience God's love for them in Jesus Christ, no matter what. When you find yourself starting to judge someone, when you see that person in church that is different than you and you think to yourself, “What are they doing here?” remember that the church is a place for sinners. It is a place for all. It is a place for you. Why? Because Jesus said it was. For he has come to save us sinners and bring us to eternal life. For that we can say, “Thanks be to God!” Amen

So, I promised you something new and I hope you enjoy it. I want to share each month a little bit of the history of each of our quilting ladies and why we love these ladies so much. The first one I am going to start out with is Eloise Knutson. Eloise is our main needle threader for heavy yarn. She will pick out the front and back for the quilts that we need to work on, then find the color of the yarn that looks the best and keep those needles going. Remember awhile back in my letter of how Sandy was kind of pokey, (but she has gotten better now) we truly rely on Eloise, because she is fast. She joined the quilting group back when they were in the old church and says they collected mostly stuff for Lutheran World Relief and stored it in someone's home. She remembers storing it for a few years. Then they got a trailer at church to store stuff to go overseas. They did most of the quilting in the new church. (Trinity). Eloise was a quilter at the time she joined the group, and her mother and aunt were good at sewing and quilting also. She thought when she started the group there were 5 women, Sue Evenson, Eleanor Coutre, Harriet Suneson, Delores Brezina, Sofie Suneson, and a lady in the trailer park. One of the questions (yes, I made them do some homework, which they handed in promptly) I asked was, "What are some changes since you joined the quilting group"? Eloise replied that we are getting nicer fabric to work with and more donated fabric. They would meet every Tuesday from 9 to 12 only in the winter. Now we are year-round. She loves that the quilters have a nice room to quilt in and they now have cupboards to store fabric at the church instead of at their homes. She also says that the most fun is to see all the beautiful quilts and of course enjoy the ladies. I put a sign out by the door, and it says Party is here, but she says it isn't a party room, it's for quilting. May have to change that sign. Lunch is always yummy, which all of us will totally agree with. What is so different from back then till now is mostly everything. Eloise didn't remember if they had coffee or met very often. When they first started, they didn't have meetings in the old church, they just talked about it at circle, and they met when it was time to pack the Lutheran Relief for overseas. Eloise said that we furnish quilts for more places now and that she is enjoying quilting more. She remembers Connie Lystrom starting it and they packed from her basement, and they packed a couple times from trailer in an old church yard. The quilters have come along way! Running out of room so I need to end this. We did 7 quilts to Dunn Cty, 7 to WestCap, 3 comfort and 1 Fire Basket. Thanks for reading!!

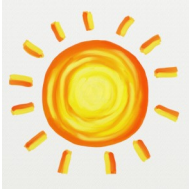


What you need:

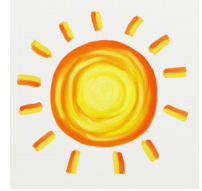
- Paper
