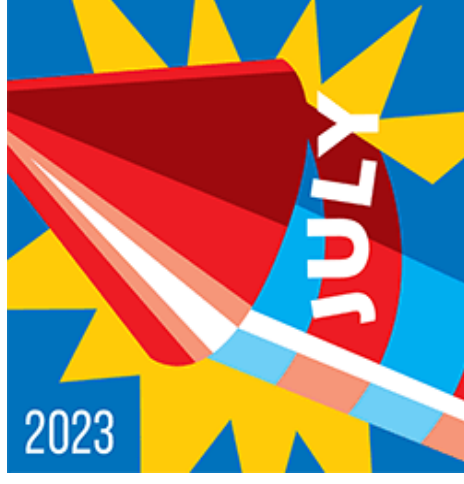

At the end of each of our worships at Vacation Bible School in June, we sang the song “This Little Light of Mine.” Our theme was “Let Your Light Shine” and the song was a perfect way to end each worship time. Almost ALL of the little kids came up. And so, surrounded by all these young people, we sang “This Little Light of Mine” together, with the kids letting their light shine. It was pretty cool singing a song about letting the light of Christ shine while seeing our youth letting their light shine, singing and showing the light of Christ through their faith and joy.

One of the greatest gifts of the church is the fact that we can let our light shine and we know that we do not do it alone. We are shining together, each our own individual light, showing the world the blazing light of grace and hope that is in Jesus Christ. The church is a place, a gathering of individuals in which our light is strengthened by the Good News of Jesus Christ. And our shared light inspires others as God works in and through us by God’s Spirit to ignite the light of faith in our hearts.

Also on that day, a middle school boy walked into the church. He wasn’t there for VBS. He was there for quilting. He had quilted with the ladies as part of the Middle School Service Day at the end of May and the quilters invited them to come back anytime they wanted on a Tuesday morning. So he did. It was so cool. The ladies shared their light and a young man was inspired by it. Who knows how long he will come, but it is awesome nonetheless.

Don’t be ashamed to let your light shine. And remember that light isn’t yours. It has been given to you by the love and grace of the light of the world, Jesus Christ. Finally, never forget that you are not a lone light in the world. The church shines with you!

Shirley is kind of a quiet gal, but don't let that fool you. We had the Boyceville Middle School come in and do some community service at the church. They did various chores around the church, but also got to spend some time with some of our quilting ladies. There were 3 different groups who came to see what we quilters do. They helped layout the quilt, thread and tie them. The ladies said they asked many questions, were very eager to learn and were very polite. They got a total of 5 quilts done, which is amazing, and they even got to see where all the quilts go around the world. Thank you to the ladies for teaching these students. Parents of these students should be very proud. Those kids all worked hard! We even have 1 student that is a part of our quilting group, he loved it so much! We enjoy having him! Sprinkle and split

A sprinkle of pepper and a dab of soap illustrate a big concept from God's Word.

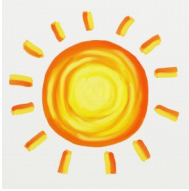


What you need:

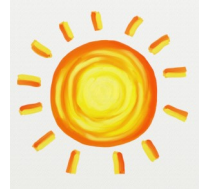
- Shallow dish
- Water
- Black ground pepper
- Toothpick
- Dish soap
- Bible

What you do:

1. With the dish on a table, fill it halfway with water. Don't jiggle the dish.
2. Sprinkle pepper on the water.
3. Dab the toothpick into a drop of soap. Then touch its tip to the center of the water and observe.
4. Read Psalm 103:8-12.
How does this experiment illustrate God's forgiveness?
5. Explain the science behind this experiment: The soap disturbs the water's surface tension. The soap molecules don't want to interact with the water. This repels the water molecules from the soap, causing the floating pepper to also move to the sides.
