I love leftovers. I'm not sure why. It might because most of my life I've eaten leftovers, often for lunch. Sometimes Amy and I even have a buffet of leftovers where we take all of our leftovers and make a plate of them. One of my favorite things is leftover movie theater popcorn. Just seems even tastier then when I had it at the movies!

Of course, having leftovers means that had more to eat then we needed. We had an abundance of food, whether we made it or we went out to eat and there was so much we couldn't finish it all. Leftovers are a sign of abundance and of blessing. Or just eyes that are bigger than our stomachs!

One of my favorite details of the story of the Feeding of the 5,000 is that there are leftovers. Jesus feeds over 5,000 people with five loaves and two fish and when the disciples get done distributing all the food, there are 12 baskets leftover. Jesus didn't just feed them, he fed them with so much they had extra! Leftovers! This is a sign of God's abundant blessing to those hungry people out in the wilderness, listening to Jesus.

We spend a lot of time thinking of what we lack in life. What we don't have. But in Jesus, we have abundant blessing. And this abundance could extend to our material possessions and financial wealth. But it also extends to our spiritual blessing as we are given abundant grace and mercy through the death and resurrection of Jesus. Our heavenly Father, through Jesus, blesses us again and again and again, freeing us from the bondage of sin, carrying our burdens, and calling us to use our gifts for the sake of our neighbors. To take our abundant blessings, whatever they may be, and using them for the sake of the other and for God's mission in the world. In other words, to share our leftovers. To be generous in all things.

You are abundantly blessed. You are loved. You have leftovers. Appreciate your blessings. Cherish those leftovers. Give thanks for them. And then, be an abundant blessing to someone else. Share your gifts. Your resources. Show your neighbor, your community, your church, the power of generosity. Finally, don't forget from where your blessings come from. They come from your loving God, who has given you all things, most especially eternal life in Jesus Christ our Lord. For that we can say, "Thanks be to God!"

She feels that being a part of the quilting group she is doing and helping people that need help. Wrap them with love. Before I end this article, I just want to say that Shirl is the only one that PB really picks on and is always throwing things at her or giving her a hard time when we have coffee hour and yes, he will come in the quilting room and pester her as well. 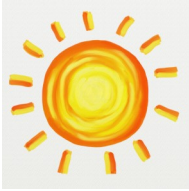
Use simple ingredients and your imagination to bake these fluffy, cloud-like treats.

### What you need:

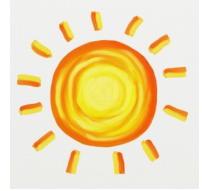
- 3 egg whites
