### PASTOR'S PAGE

### September 2023

On our Mission Trip in Denver, my Crew was cleaning up the yard of a house. But we weren't weeding or doing things like that. We were throwing out garbage, old shingles, and so much other stuff, much of it having been left by drug users and others who had taken advantage of the 90-year-old man who lived in that house, who was out there with us. We broke down couches, threw out mattresses, and had stuff you couldn't imagine. We were working very hard.

And they were very appreciative. The man's daughter was there, and she cried when she saw all that we were doing. Such emotion, such genuine thankfulness, would have easily been enough. After all, we were there to serve and that is what we were doing. But she wanted to do something more. And so, while we hauled and threw away and cleaned up their backyard area, she was making us New Mexico-style breakfast burritos. And man, they were incredibly delicious. We stopped what we were doing and ate those burritos, all the while hearing about the life of the 90-year-old man whose house we were helping to give back to him. Over six weeks later, I'm struck by the fact that though we were serving them, they were giving so much back to us and I guarantee that not one kid will ever forget that day for the rest of their lives. It was an example of thankfulness and how in giving we receive so much more.

I wonder sometimes if we have that radical kind of thankfulness. The daughter of the man was compelled to give something back to us. There was nothing we could have said that would have stopped her. Later on, another person was compelled to give us something as a thank you when we had done far, far less. Gratitude moved them to generosity. Generosity of spirit, generosity of love, generosity of thankfulness that moved them to give something back for what they had received.

Do we act with that kind of radical generosity in thankfulness for what Jesus Christ has given us? After all, the Son of God saves us from our sins and brings us to eternal life. This Jesus carries our burdens, strengthens us in weakness, gives us hope in despair, and has showered us with all the gifts of life. How are we responding to the generosity we receive? Do we feel entitled to it? Do we look at giving back, whether through offerings or signing up to help at something or lifting up the needs of our neighbor as something that we can do if we have time or stuff left over? Or, are we compelled to give back out of thankfulness to all that we have received?

My prayer for you this day is that the Holy Spirit would inspire radical generosity in your heart. My hope is that you might generously give of your time, talent, and financial resources to the mission of the Gospel in the world. That you might put your name on that sign-up list. That you might think of the ministry of the church when you take that checkbook out. That you might walk through the doors for worship or take time in prayer to give thanks to the Lord you has given you everything and more. And I hope that you might see that as you serve others in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ that you receive so much more than you give.






