### Why Follow?

Have you ever stopped to wonder why we do what we do as Christians? Why do we follow Jesus? What is it about him and this life to which he calls us that makes us want to be a part of it? Why are we Christian? Why do we become part of a church? What does all this mean for us and how does it shape our life? That is the theme of our Wednesday series in Lent this year: "Why Follow?"

We may have many reasons for following Jesus. It may be something that was faithfully taught to us by our parents and grandparents. Following Jesus may be something that has been part of our lives from the very beginning. Or maybe our Christian faith is something that started later in life for us. Maybe there was some big change in our lives that helped to bring us to Christ. Or maybe there was some person who reached out to us and greatly encouraged us to follow Jesus. However we came to faith in Christ, this life of faith is something that we share together.

And I think that we also need to say that a life of faith is not just about us and our decisions. We believe that Christ calls us to follow him. We don't just go looking for him ourselves. And we believe and trust in the work of the Holy Spirit in our lives. Faith is not something that we create in ourselves. But faith is a gift given to us by the Holy Spirit.

But there are still reasons that we walk this path of faith together. There are still reasons that we choose to live out our faith in Christ. And that is what I would like to talk about this year in Lent.

Besides our two services on Ash Wednesday on February 14<sup>th</sup> (with meal served by the Confirmation Youth), there are five themes that we will be reflecting on together about why we follow Jesus. They are:

**Belonging** (February 21): Following Jesus together gives us a sense of belonging and community with one another. Matthew 4:18-22. Meal served by the Youth Gathering Youth.

**Purpose** (February 28) Following Jesus gives a purpose and direction to our lives in an increasingly complex and confusing world. Galatians 5:13. Meal served by the Men of Trinity

**<u>Strength</u>** (March 6) Following Jesus gives us strength beyond just ourselves. Matthew 11:28 -30. Meal served by Church Council.

**Hope**: (March 13) Following Jesus gives us hope for the future and an assurance that God's mercy is for us. Hebrews 11:1. Meal served by the Women of Trinity.

**Grace**: (March 20) Following Jesus allows us to live in God's grace each day and to share that grace with others. Ephesians 2:8-9. Meal served by the Youth Gathering Youth.

I hope that you can join us for Lent Wednesday services and meals. Meals will start at 5:30 pm and worship will be at 6:30 pm with Holden Evening Prayer (except for Ash Wednesday). May God bless you during this season of Lent!


### WOMEN OF TRINITY






### Try this chilly new take on a healthy snack.
