### <sup>48</sup>You are witnesses of these things." Luke 24:48

Here in May, I will continue a tradition that is very important to me. I will take my yearly pilgrimage to Wrigley Field to watch the Chicago Cubs. It is a trip that is steeped in memory, most especially of my Dad, who will have died 32 years ago this May 10<sup>th</sup>. I have gone every year since I was born except for the year he died, as I just couldn't do it. In connection to that, I have paired my yearly holy pilgrimage to Wrigley with taking my nephew Logan, now 21, with me to Wrigley. I have been taking him every year since he was 10 and I have been able to take him to his first night game, his first game in the bleachers, and when we go on May 17th, I will take him to the best Cubs bar, Murphy's Bleachers, before the game and buy him his first beer in Wrigley Field a little bit later. (Note: I have been in Murphy's with him before, but during the offseason when everyone can go in. But not before a game. Just want to be accurate!).

But maybe most importantly of all, I have been able to witness to him about the grandfather he never knew. I've been able to share stories with him, teach him how to keep score, just like my Dad taught me, and to continue to nurture the love of the Cubs that have continued for generations. And since I don't have kids, it has been a way to continue a legacy that I hope he will pass on one day to his kids. To witness.

Jesus tells the disciples that they are witnesses. Witnesses to the death and resurrection of the Messiah, Jesus Christ. Witnesses of forgiveness of sins that are in his name. Witnesses. And what are we, dear friends, but the same thing? We are called to be witnesses to the Gospel of Jesus Christ. To proclaim Christ crucified and risen. To proclaim the good news that we are saved by grace through faith. To witness to the power of God's love in our lives every day. You get a chance to be that witness, to the old and the young, to family and friends, to strangers and others. You can be a witness through words and actions, in ways big and small. But a witness you are and a witness you need to be, for the world needs the hope, love, and grace of Jesus Christ. People need that hope, that love, that grace. I know that I need it. I have been privileged to not only be the one witnessing but also to be witnessed to, even by some of you. It is who we are as the people of God: witnesses to God's love in Jesus Christ in the world.

I miss my Dad and I'm glad I get to witness to his memory by continuing our shared traditions and passing them on the best I can. But he not only passed onto me those things, he passed onto me that I am loved by Jesus Christ no matter what and that in Jesus there is always hope. And so, I pass that on to you all as well, as a witness. You are loved. You are forgiven. You are saved. And you always have hope because Jesus is with you. For that we can say, "Thanks be to God!" Amen





### **a fun** Flower Frog

A flower frog sits atop a vase to help arrange flowers and hold stems in place. This personalized frog will become a favorite!

### What you need:

- Air-dry clay
- Roller
- Vase (or jar)
- Plastic knife
- Straw
- Acrylic paint and brushes



### What you do:

- 1. Roll out a portion of clay to about ½-inch thickness.
- 2. Cut out a circle that's slightly larger than the vase opening. (This will allow the finished frog to sit securely on top.)
- To make holes for stems, use a straw to punch out circle shapes. If you make more than one frog, try arranging the holes in different patterns.
- 4. Let dry completely. Then personalize your work with acrylic paint.
- 5. When dry, place the frog atop the vase. Arrange flowers and greenery to make a Mother's Day bouquet.

### Pastor Brad Goes on Sabbatical this Summer

In 2023, Church Council approved Pastor Brad taking a sabbatical starting on Saturday, June 8<sup>th</sup> through Tuesday, July 9<sup>th</sup>. As we prepare for PB's sabbatical, below is some important information.

- What is a sabbatical? A sabbatical is an intentional time away for a pastor to renew and recharge physically, spiritually, and emotionally.
- How often does a pastor take a sabbatical? The ELCA recommends that a pastor take a threemonth sabbatical every seven years of ministry. Pastor Brad will have served Trinity 22 years in August of this year, and this will be his first sabbatical, which is only lasting about five weeks.
- How will PB spend his sabbatical? Pastor Brad can spend it however he wants. He intends to do some traveling with Amy and spend a lot of time not working, which is his favorite hobby. No doubt you will find him on the golf course a lot when he is in town! He intends that the time away will be a chance to get refreshed, renewed, and re-energized as a pastor.
- Who will lead worship in Pastor Brad's absence? Pastor Brad has arranged for all worship services on Sunday and Wednesday to be served by other pastors, so there will be no cancelled or missed services.
- What happens if there is an emergency? Just like when PB is on vacation, there will be an oncall pastor to take care of any pastoral care emergencies.
- What will Pastor Brad's contact be with the congregation during his sabbatical? This sabbatical is meant to be a full unplugging of the congregation for Pastor Brad. He will not return phone calls, emails, or text messages. If you see Pastor Brad around town, he will of course have a conversation with you and greet you, but he is to be away from the church until he returns on July 10<sup>th</sup>. However, if there is a tragedy that occurs in the congregation, PB may choose to return.
- Does the sabbatical replace Pastor Brad's vacation? No. PB still receives his normal vacation time.
- What will the congregation need to do during the sabbatical? There are a few things that everyone at Trinity can do to help during PB's time away. They include:

Keeping Pastor Brad, Amy, and Trinity in prayer.

- Respecting Pastor Brad's boundaries during his time away. Please don't contact him regarding church matters.
- Continue to support the church with your financial gifts, your attendance at worship, and your service to our mission and ministry in the world!
