If there was a theme for October 2024 here at Trinity, it could be "Baptism Month." We have three baptisms during the five Sundays of the this month and if I'm being honest, I could have scheduled a baptism every Sunday if I had wanted. We never take having a baptism for granted. It is an awesome celebration as we welcome a new brother or sister in Christ and give thanks for the promises of God in Jesus Christ is placed upon them and celebrate with families as they promise to raise their child in the faith and we promise to support them in doing so.

Besides those three Sunday's, we are also celebrating Confirmation Sunday on the last Sunday of the month, October 27<sup>th</sup>, which is the Affirmation of Baptism. 17 young people will gather to affirm the faith that they were baptized in, standing before their fellow brothers and sisters in Christ to confess their shared faith. We will celebrate with them as we have nurtured them in the faith and given them a place to learn about how much God in Jesus Christ has loved them and will continue to love them throughout their life. We will place quilts around them as a symbol of the love of God that will always be with them, just as we give quilts in that same act around them when they were baptized all those years prior.

And in the lone Sunday left, October 13, we gather in our Cross Generational Worship service to lift up that we are connected together in that shared baptismal faith across the generations. Our theme is the Bread of Life and just as we are one bread, one body, so it is with us as the church, connected together by the Spirit which gives us faith and reminds us of the promises of God in Jesus we have all received in baptism. Though we are all unique and different, we are connected together: one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of us all, as it says in Ephesians chapter 4.

I hope that you will join us in all these celebrations of our shared baptismal faith. Celebrate with parents as we welcome new brothers and sisters in Christ into this family of God. Celebrate with the whole church as young people affirm their faith. And celebrate as the church at large as we lift up our shared faith and the love and grace we have all received in Jesus Christ, who brings us to eternal life. May God bless you today and always!







### Parsonage Update:


