

Marlys Nusberger had asked her to join so she could get out and meet new people. Cheryl also enjoyed sewing and she was always interested in quilting. Now Cheryl claimed that she did not know much about quilting, but the sewing that she did was making dolls and doll clothes. The group was called The Giving Dolls of Dunn County. These dolls would go to Mayo hospitals in Menomonie and Eau Claire, sheriff department, Steppingstones, Foster Care, every elementary school in Dunn County, and anywhere else they wanted them. They even sent 20 to the Ronald McDonald House in the past 2 years. Any young child in Dunn County who has gone through or is going through a traumatic experience gets a doll. This is wonderful and the clothes that Cheryl made were beautiful. Cheryl said there were about 8 or 9 in our quilting group when she started and right now, we have about 14. She helps tie the quilts, shares her recipes and tells stories. She says that since she has joined there are more women her age joining, and she even feels more confident putting a quilt top together and that the most fun is the whole group. You never know what you are going to talk about and lots of laughs. She loves the quilts that the ladies bring in to show and tell and she gets advice when she needs it for making a quilt. Cheryl says this whole group makes her feel very welcome and she loves saying our prayer before we eat. She remembers how much time it took to thread the serger. I can honestly say Cheryl, we all feel that way towards the serger. Last part about Cheryl is she is the one that needs to go to the alter more than anyone!!! To funny! Thanks for reading and stop in anytime and see what we do. Even if you don't sew there is always something else to do and learn. We will teach you!


We are looking for people to sign up for furnishing food for the CREW kids. Please sign up on the table in the narthex.



Make decorative stones
as reminders of God's

What you need:

- Flat, smooth stones
- Printed, decorative napkins
- Paintbrush
- Clear-drying craft glue
- Scissors
- Permanent marker

What you do:

1. Unfold the napkin, carefully separating the printed side from the solid side.
2. Brush a thin layer of glue atop a stone. Lay the napkin (printed side up) on the glue and press down. Paint more glue over the napkin. Let dry.
3. Turn the stone over and paint more glue on the back. Wrap the napkin edges around the stone, trimming as needed. Paint more glue over the napkin. Let dry.
4. On the stone, write an attribute of God (loving, wise, powerful, merciful, etc.).
5. Repeat with more stones. Use them as gifts, paperweights, table decorations, etc.
