PASTOR'S PAGE

This is the day that the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad in it. Psalm 118:24

On May 29th, you will hear the collective sound of joy throughout the streets of Boyceville in the afternoon. Why? Because that is the last day of school. As the kids leave school, they will be rejoice as school ends and summer begins. You will also hear joy from their teachers as well the next day, as summer begins for them. There is nothing greater than when summer vacation begins. It is a great day. No more classes. No more homework. No more nothing. Freedom. The only thing comparable as an adult is that feeling when you walk out of work and you have vacation the next day. But that is often only for a week or a few days, not a couple of months like summer vacation.

Sometimes we wake up in the morning and don't feel like rejoicing at all. We don't look forward to the day at all. And it can be easy to see why. We are bombarded with bad news all the time. We also experience our own personal suffering and hurts. It can be hard to be excited about anything, let alone rejoice about anything. But what if we approached every day like it was the last day of school? What if we approached every day with rejoicing hearts?

After all, every day is a gift. It is a gift from God, and these days are precious and few. I think that is the theme of the above verse. We rejoice in the day because that day is a gift. Here in May I will be remembering the 32nd anniversary of my Dad's death and one of the biggest lesson's I learned was that life is a gift. Life is hard. It can be grueling and painful and tiring and awful and all those things. But it is also precious and wonderful and amazing and above all, a gift.

So, maybe, try to approach each day like it is the last day of school: with joy. Not every day will be filled with joy. But if we start with joy, with gratitude, with a reminder that life is a gift, that might make our days a little better. After all, we are loved and saved by Jesus Christ and that should give us enough reason to rejoice every day.

May God be with you today and always.

Thank you so very much for the recent monetary donations and much needed food and cereal donations to the food pantry and for the weekend meal program. Just recently a federal program that supported local WI produced products (Farm to Food Banks and Farm to School programs) was recently discontinued by Federal Government. This affects us locally coupled with that announcement that our TEFAP Foods have been reduced by 30%. As the food pantry faces more and more difficulty procuring foods our customers are beginning to feel the difference. We at West CAP will continue to do our best to provide needed food assistance to our families in need and advocate at the State and National levels in support of food assistance programs.

Currently we remain in need of cereal as our number one priority in food sources. Besides shelf stable items we are open Wed. mornings and from 1pm-7pm on Thursdays to accept any perishable food products (dairy, meats, frozen meals, produce etc.). Again I can't thank you all enough for your amazing support and keeping West CAP's Food Programs in your ministry and prayers. Have a wonderful Spring!

What you need:

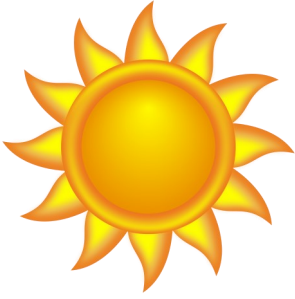
- 4 oz. cream cheese, softened

- Adult help



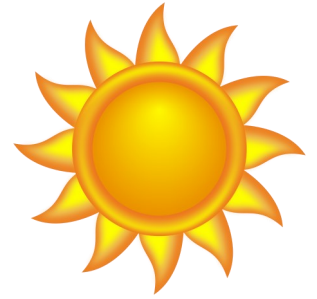
What you do:
