# PASTOR'S PAGE

Since early February, I've been helping out with Lutheran Campus Ministry at UW-Stout as their Executive Director is on maternity leave, so every Monday night, other than the Monday's we have Lagers with the Lord (and this month, they are going to join us for Lagers), I've been hanging out with college students. As I have done now for a decade, once a semester I have a Q&A session where they can ask me any question they want. Questions about faith, about life, about Star Wars and Disney. It is one of my favorite things to do (and one of the scariest) and often breeds great conversations and interesting avenues of discussion.

When I did this last one, as we had a discussion off of a question, one of the kids brought up an old Lutheran Christian band named Lost & Found. This is a duo (you can find them on Spotify) that I saw live in concert at a campus ministry conference myself back in my college days (I think it was 1997) and I probably last saw live when they made an appearance at one of the first Youth Gatherings I took our kids on. It has been a LONG TIME since I had thought about them. But after this mention, I pulled them up on Spotify and listened to them the whole way home and then a bunch the next day. It resurrected all sorts of memories of me, of a time in my life when I really felt God's call to ministry, of great friends, some whom I have lost contact with over the decades, and also the power of music to connect the generations as a college student today and my college self from 30 years ago knew the same obscure Christian band.

But that is the thing about resurrection. It can pop up on us in all sorts of ways and things that we thought were dead can spring back to life. The thing about the Holy Spirit is that it is always stirring within us, moving within us, and reminding us of all that Jesus Christ has done for us, reminding us that this Son of God defeated sin and death on the cross and rose from the dead to bring us to eternal life. As we celebrate the resurrection of Jesus Christ on Easter Sunday on April 5<sup>th</sup>, we also are reminded that every day there is an opportunity for resurrection.

In what ways is God moving you today? In what ways is God resurrecting your faith, your hope, your love? How are you being made new in Jesus right now so that you can serve the Lord with your giving, your talents, your time, your faith? How is the Spirit moving you, maybe even resurrecting something in you that you thought was long dormant?

I invite you, in this season of resurrection, to open your hearts to the what the Lord is resurrecting in you. I invite to see and feel where the Spirit is moving you; to how seeds long planted might be springing up into new fruit. And I invite you to give thanks and praise to the Son of God who rose from the grave to bring you to eternal life, not only on Easter Sunday, but every single day. May God bless you today and always!

The Parament colors for April change between the primary color of **Lent, Purple**, a costly dye color, represents royalty, symbolizing that Jesus, as the true King of Kings, WHITE as purity & simplicity and **BLACK** representing deep sorrow, mortality & mourning. Wearing **Lent** colors are reminders in worship to visually signify the changing seasons, festivals, and theological themes of the church year to our-selves & with our community.

ELCA remains focused on the continuing of **ELCA World Hunger's 40 Days of Giving**: This initiative invites participation through study, prayer, reflection & giving through the season of **Lent**.



## HANDPRINT BUTTERFLY OF NEW LIFE

The butterfly reminds us of new life and the Resurrection. After three days, Jesus rose from the dead and brings us the hope of new beginnings. This simple craft helps children celebrate that joyful truth.

### What you need:

- Light-colored construction paper
- Card stock
- Glue
- Paint
- Paintbrush
- Paper towel or baby wipe



### What you do:

- Cut out a butterfly body from the construction paper.
- Glue the butterfly body onto the card stock.
- Use a paintbrush to coat the palm of one hand with paint.
- Press your painted hand beside the butterfly body to create a wing.
- Repeat with your other hand to make the second wing.
- Clean your hands with a paper towel or baby wipe.
- Optional: Add Luke 24:5-6 (NIV) around the butterfly or on its body:

"Why do you look for the living among the dead? He is not here; he has risen!"

Answers: "... fixing our eyes on Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of faith. For the joy set before him he endured the cross, scorning its shame, and sat down at the right hand of the throne of God. Consider him who endured such opposition from sinners, so that you will not grow weary and lose heart." Hebrews 12:2-3 NIV
