Have you ever given a gift to someone you truly disliked? I mean, really, really disliked? Or someone that had really hurt you? I'm sure there were times as kids that we got invited to that birthday party of someone that we were kind of friends with and we had to take a gift to that we didn't really want to, but I'm talking about bringing a gift to someone that you truly did something bad to you or someone you really despised. Of course you wouldn't do that. You wouldn't give a gift to someone who wronged you, or betrayed you, or constantly hurt you or wronged you in some way. Seems completely illogical.

And yet, our Savior Jesus Christ does that for us every day. In Romans 5:8 it says, "But God proves his love for us in that while we still were sinners Christ died for us." Jesus dies for us sinners. Sinners who betray him, who turn our back on him, who constantly don't listen to him or do the opposite of what we are supposed to do. And yet, despite that, Jesus gives his life for us. Jesus goes to the depths of hell for us. Jesus defeats sin and death for us. Jesus gives us his grace and mercy for us. For sinners. Why? To save us. To show us that we are loved. To show us that we are cared for and important. It seems illogical because it is. But Jesus does it anyways. To save you.

We call this grace. And it is a gift and it is given to you every day. You have not earned it (you are a sinner, remember). It is given by a loving Savior, a loving Messiah, a loving Son of God. Jesus shows up at your birthday party even though you have constantly treated him (and others) badly and gives you the greatest gift you could have ever received: eternal life. This comes through the forgiveness of your sins won by his death the cross and his resurrection. All done for you. All done through love. All for you.

We might not go to a birthday party and give gifts to people who sin against us, but Jesus Christ does. He does this for you. Every single day. And for that we can say, "Thanks be to God!" May God bless you this day and always!

In the Know:

Month of June, in the ELCA, sits in the second half of the church year, or the 'Season after Pentecost', often marked as the longest season in the liturgical year.

June focuses on ELCA highlighting the act of **Welcoming and Protection**: the church's responsibility to protect, nurture and speak up for children, drawing on Jesus' words in Matthew 19:13-14. And that seeing the **Grace in you** as a **Starting Point**. Emphasizing that **God's Love** is unconditional and *not earned*, it's a "free gift" perspective, that *drives* us to serve our neighbors.

The Parament color for the month of JUNE is mainly **GREEN**, representing, after the Pentecost, one's Growth & Maturity in Faith.

Sidenote: Pentecost is also known as the 'birthday of the church', followed by the mission of the Holy Spirit, now in all of us.

As always, continuing our mission in **Faith & Love** with our neighbors in Christ.
