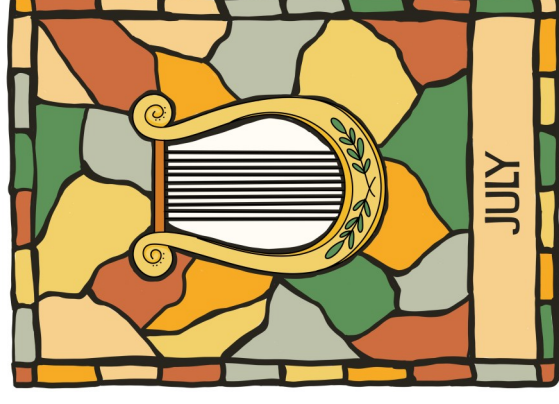

On July 4th, we will celebrate the 250th anniversary of our country. There will be grand celebrations across our country to celebrate this momentous occasion. As a Bicentennial baby, born a few weeks before we celebrated the 200th birthday of our country, I've always been interested in the founding of our great nation and the sacrifices, boldness, and grand experiment in freedom that birthed the United State of America.

That word, "freedom," will get tossed around a lot on July 4th, and it can have all sorts of meanings, but I always think of it in the context of Galatians chapter 5. As Paul puts it in Galatians 5:13, "For you were called to **freedom**, brothers and sisters, only do not use your **freedom** as an opportunity for self-indulgence, but through love become enslaved to one another." Transform slice-and-bake

What you need:

- 1 roll refrigerated sugar cookie dough
- Knife
- Baking sheet
- Wooden craft sticks
- Frosting
- Sprinkles
- Clear treat bags
- Ribbon



What you do:

1. Freeze the cookie dough for 15 to 20 minutes to firm it up, then slice into ¼-inch rounds.
2. Place cookies on a baking sheet about 2 inches apart.
3. Bake at 350 degrees for 5 minutes.
4. Remove from the oven and gently press a wooden stick halfway into the bottom of each cookie.
5. Return to the oven and bake 3 to 5 more minutes, until lightly golden.
6. Let cookies cool completely.
7. Decorate with frosting to create smiling faces and add sprinkles.
8. Slip each cookie pop into a treat bag and tie with ribbon.
