## PASTOR'S PAGE



It is October and with that comes Halloween at the end of the month and that means there are a ton of scary movies on television and all over the movie theaters. Of course, all year they show horror movies and I have to admit, I am not a big scary movie or horror movie fan. I have an appreciation for the original "Halloween" and I saw the original "Psycho" way too young and "The Silence of the Lambs" is one of my favorite movies, though I would say that is more of a suspenseful movie than a horror movie. But most of the horror movies, like "Friday the 13<sup>th</sup>" or "Nightmare on Elm Street" or newer ones like "Saw," "Sinners," or "28 Days Later" are just not my cup of tea. That fear has no power over us in the end, for we that promise that can never be taken away, that promise of salvation and that hope that endures, even in the midst of fear.

Sometimes it is good to be scared. It shakes us up, makes us think, and can inspire us, whether it be a scary movie, TV show, or book. But when it comes to the true fears of life, the things that make you really scared, remember that you are not alone and that you do not need to be afraid. Your Savior Jesus Christ is with you and will be with you always. For that we can say, "Thanks be to God!"

## October 2026

### In the Know:

**Month of October**, in the ELCA, is in the cycle focus on the **Time after Pentecost**: October Sundays fall during the 'long green season' focusing on Jesus' teachings, parables, and discipleship.

The "**Long Green Season**" signifies **Spiritual Growth**. Just as plants grow in nature, this period focuses on our own day-to-day growth, or the 'ordinary life of Faith', in maturing spiritually as believers in Faith. It's called 'ordinary life of Faith', not because it's boring or unimportant, but because we're living out the teachings through many weeks weaved together, often leading us down paths we didn't expect—just as Jesus did in grace—into unknown places, across unfamiliar lands, and through seasons of grief and hope happening in our own lives, our communities, our world. October falls right in the middle of the final, longest stretch of this 'green period' until just before Advent, into late November.

**GREEN** being the traditional liturgical color for this time representing life, hope, and continuous growth in October.

*We continue to share our bounties with others, may it be **Time, Talents or Resources**, no matter the quantity, as we are Living out one's Faith through **care** in being a good neighbor & in 'seeing' the **joys** in our everyday life.*

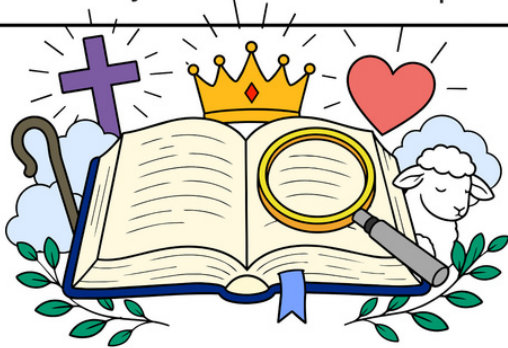

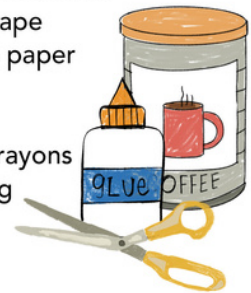
## Give Thanks with Music



Music is one way to give thanks to God. Make these simple instruments to accompany your singing!

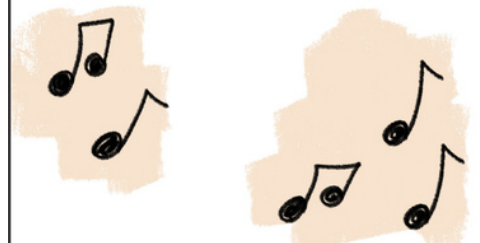
### What you need:
